NHE following descriptions of GRANTS OF LAND, with the names of the persons to whom they were originally promised, or by whom they are now claimed, are published for general information, in order that all parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

It is requested that within three months from the present date, the particulars required by the Government Notice of the 1st October 1838, may be accurately furnished to this Office, viz:-

Surname and all Christian names of the person in whose favor the Deed is to be prepared, written at full length, his residence, and the intended name of the property.

Also, (if required in any name but that of the original Promisee), the grounds of the claim, and a letter from the said Promisee, if living, and from all intermediate Assigns, if any, giving his and their consent and sanction thereto, and witnessed either by a Magistrate or a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

If these be duly furnished and satisfactory, and if no Caveat be lodged or other cause of uncertainty appear, the Deeds will be prepared accordingly, as soon as possible after the expiration of the stated period of three months.

If the required particulars be not furnished within that period, or if a Caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty arise, which cannot be satisfactorily determined by the Government, the case will be referred to the Commissioners of Claims, and the parties subjected to the expence that creek. of that proceeding. Promised by Sir Ralph Darling, on 21st October, 1831, to the Rev. Henry Fulton, and possession given on 28th January, 1832, as a Clergyman's portion; and the deeds are now, at his request, advertised for Mr. Blackett.

Quit-rent, £12 13s. 4d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1839.

Andrew Brown, 200, Two hundred acres, parish unnamed, near Lithgow's Valley and Hassan's Walls, about two and a-half miles north of the Village reserve at Bowen's Hollow; bounded on the east by a line north commencing at Lithgow's Valley stream, 35 chains; on the north by a line west 80 chains; on the west by a line south 40 chains; and on the south by a line east 15 chains to Lithgow Valley stream, and by that arteam.

Promised by Governor Macquarie on the 31st

March. 1821.

Quit-rent 4s. sterling per annum, commencing 1st January, 1827.

#### CUMBERLAND.

63. John Buckley, 100, One hundred acres, parish of Bankstown, commencing at a stake on the George's River old road, being the south-east corner of Thomas Collins' 50 acres purchase, and bounded on part of the west by a line north 11 chains; on the south by a line west 2 chains, dividing it from Collins' 50 acres aforesaid; again on the west by a line north 36 chains dividing it from another portion of 50 acres purchased by Thomas Collins; on the north by a line east 39 chains to the George's River old road, dividing it from a road 50 links wide; and on the south-east by the George's River old road.

BATHURST

71. GEORGE KABLE, 80, Eighty acres, parish of Bathurst, No. 2 allotment, in Queen Charlotte's Vale; bounded on the north by James Vincent's allotments east 45 chains from the Vale Creek to the Macquarie River; on the south by a line east from the Creek to the River 55 chains; on the east by the Macquarie River; and on the west by the Creek. The allotment being 16 chains wide.

Promised by Sir Ralph Darling, to Richard Mortimer, on the 17th May, 1830, and possession given on 6th December following, as a small grant, in lieu of 100 acres promised by Sir Thomas Brisbane, being also in lieu of 100 acres, of which he received possession on June 16, 1830. The Deeds were advertised in Mortimer's name, on 7th September, 1839, but they are now at his request re-advertised for Mr. Kable.

GEORGE KABLE, 85, Eighty-five acres, parish of Bathurst, No. 3 of the allotments in Queen Charlotte's Vale; bounded on the north by Richard Mortimer's land, east 55 chains from the Vale Creek to the Macquarie River; on the south by a line from the Vale Creek to the River 46 chains; on the east by the Macquarie River; and on the west by the Creek. BRISBANE.

John Town, 1,280, Twelve hundred and eighty acres, parish unnamed at the Giant's Leap; bounded on the west by the east boundary line of the village reserve of Giant's Leap, bearing north 127 chains, commencing on the River Goulburn on the north by a line east 120 chains; on the east by a line south 89 chains to the north boundary of John Pike's 663 acres purchase; and on the south by the north and west boundary lines of that land bearing west 80 chains; then south 80 chains to the River Goulburn, and then by that river upwards to the point of commence-

74. GEORGE SMITH HALL, 640, Six hundred and forty acres, parish unnamed at Robert's Swamp, on the Hawkesbury River; commencing at the south west corner of Robert's 120 acres grant; bounded on the south by lines bearing

wouth 62 degrees west 35 chains, north 76 de-80 chains; on the west by a line north 41 chains; on the north by lines bearing north 75 degrees east 78 chains; south 76 degrees east 58 chains; and north 62 degrees east 10 chains; and on the east by a line south 49 degrees east 47 chains and 50 Hoks.

Promised by Sir Ralph Darling on the 15th of September, 1829, and possession given on the 17th of November following, as an additional grant.

WILLIAM SIMS BELL, 1000, One thousand acres, parish of Lemington, commending as the northern extreme of the west boundary of the Church and School Grant, and bounded on the boundary line bearing south; on the south by a west line of eighty chains, on the west by a north line of sixty chains to Hunter's River; and on the north by Hunter's River downwards to the northern extreme of the west boundary line of the Church and School Grant.

Authorised by Sir Thomas Brisbane on the 14th July, 1825.

Quit-rent £8 6s. 8d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st. January, 1833.

Note.—This description is in lieu of that used in the advertisement of the 8th April, 1839, and which effoneously stated the land to contain only 700 actes.

Promised by Sir Ralph Darling to John Moxon, on the 11th November, 1830, and possession given on 1st. January, 1831, as a small grant. The deeds were advertised for Moxon, on 7th September, 1839, but they are now at his request, re-advertised for Mr. Brown.

Quit-rent 8s. 4d. sterling per annum, commencing 1st. January, 1838.

#### ROXBURGH.

78. WILLIAM CHARLES WENTWORTH, 100, One hundred acres, parish of Kelso, No. 2 of the Veterans' allotments; bounded on the north by part of the south boundary of No. 1 allotment, commencing 27 chains west of its south-east corner; on the east by a line south 12 chains; on the south by a line west 92 chains to the Macquarie River; and on the west by that river.

Promised by Sir R. Darling to Gilbert Wright on the 12th July, 1830, and possession authorised 18th September following. The deeds were advertised for Wright on 17th July, 1839, but they are now at the joint request of himself and Mr. Thomas Kite, an intermediate purchaser, re-advertised for Mr. Wentworth

Quit-rent one farthing for ever; the promisee being a disbanded soldier of the New South Wales Royal Veteran Corps.

79. WILLIAM CHARLES WENTWORTH, 100. One hundred acres, parish of Kelso, No. 3 of the Veterans' allotments; bounded on the north by allotment No. 2; on the east by a line south 10 chains and 50 links from the south-east corner of allotment No. 2; on the south by a line west 104 chains 50 links to the Macquarie River; and on the west by that river.

Promised by Sir R. Darling to William Maskill on the 12th of July 1830, and possession authorized on the 18th of September following. The Deeds were authorised for Maskill on the 17th of July, 1889, but they are now at the joint request of himself and Mr. Thomas Kite, an intermediate purchaser, re-advertised for Mr. Wentworth.

Quit-rent one farthing for ever; the promises being a disbanded soldier of the New South Wales Royal Veteran Corps.
