COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bill, about to be brought under consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

*By His Excellency's Command,

1.—“A Bill to provide for the making and repairing of Parish Roads in the Colony of New South Wales.”

It being expedient that an Act should be passed for the making, repairing, and keeping in repair of parish roads throughout the Colony, and the Act, 6th William IV, No. 11, being insufficient for such purpose,—It is proposed.

That the said Act 6th William IV. No. 11, shall be repealed.

That the proprietors and occupiers of land through which any parish road passes or may pass, shall elect Trustees for the same.

That the Magistrates in Petty Sessions assembled, of any district, on requisition signed by any number of the proprietors or occupiers of the lands through which any such road may pass, being in the proportion of not less than three for every mile of such road, or not less than one-third of the whole number of the proprietors or occupiers of such lands,

and of the lands or buildings within three miles of, and usually approached by such road, shall call a meeting of such proprietors and occupiers for the purpose of electing Trustees for such road; the number of such Trustees being previously determined by the Magistrates, and such Magistrates shall appoint a Magistrate to preside at such meeting, and two assessors to assist him.

That the only question to be submitted for the consideration of such meeting shall be, whether or not they deem it expedient to appoint Trustees for such road. And if it be the opinion of the meeting that Trustees should be appointed, the presiding Magistrate and assessors shall certify the same to the Magistrates in Petty Sessions, and such Magistrates shall appoint another meeting for the election of such Trustees.

That all persons being the proprietors or occupiers of any lands or buildings within the limits aforesaid, of the value of £200 or upwards, or being in the actual occupation of any lands or buildings within such limits, of the annual value of £10, shall be allowed to vote at such election.

That the election shall commence and be concluded on the same day.

That the presiding Magistrate and his assessors shall within five days from such election, report to the Magistrates in Petty Sessions the names of the persons elected; and such Magistrates shall thereupon declare such persons to be the Trustees for such road; and such Trustees shall continue in office for three years, when a new election shall take place in manner aforesaid.

That such Trustees, at the expiration of every three years, or oftener, if required, in writing, by any three or more proprietors or occupiers, entitled to vote as aforesaid, shall give to the Trustees elected for the succeeding three years, or to the proprietors or occupiers so requiring it of them as aforesaid, an accurate account of all monies received and disbursed by them in the performance of their trust, and hand over any balance which may be due by them in respect thereof, to the Trustees succeeding them in such trust.

That such Trustees shall have the like powers to make assessments on lands and buildings within their district, for the purpose of making and repairing such roads, and the bridges thereon, as are proposed to be vested in the Commissioners by the proposed Act, now under consideration of the Council, entitled "*An Act to authorise the election of Commissioners of Police and Public Works, in the Colony of New South Wales*;" provided they shall not in any one year levy on any property so to be assessed, a sum exceeding six pence in the pound on the net annual value thereof, and provided further, that they shall not include convict servants in any such assessment.

That such Trustees may buy, sell, or exchange land, for the purposes of their trust.

That the Trustees may appoint, and pay Surveyors.

That such Surveyors shall have all the like powers as are now vested in the Surveyor General and his Assistants.

That whenever Trustees shall be elected for any Parish Road, intended to be made through any part of a district, where no such road had theretofore been made, the Surveyors shall survey and mark out the most advantageous line for such road; and after such line shall have been approved by the Trustees, the surveyors shall transmit a plan and explanation thereof to the Surveyor General; and if the Surveyor General shall certify to the Trustees that the line of such intended road does not in any way interfere with any public road or intended public road, or with any parish road, such Trustees may forthwith order the commencement of such road; provided that nothing in the proposed act shall prevent the opening of parish roads by order of the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in manner set forth in the Act 4 Wm. IV. No. 11, nor prevent persons from claiming compensation under the provisions of that Act; but the persons to whom any question of compensation shall be referred, shall take into consideration, as well the advantages as the disadvantages which may result to the parties claiming compensation, from the opening of such road.

That so soon as the Trustees shall certify that such road is practicable for passengers and carriages, the Governor by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, may appoint and direct tolls to be demanded and taken thereon, the same to be paid to such Trustees for the purposes of their trust; provided that no turnpike shall be erected nor any toll demanded, until it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Governor and Executive Council, that a sum of money equal to one hundred pounds per mile for the entire length of such road, or at least for seven continuous miles thereof, has been either expended, or raised and in the hands of the Trustees to be expended thereon.

That the Trustees, with consent of the Governor, may mortgage the tolls on such road, to raise money for the making and repairing thereof.

That the Trustees, with approval of the Governor, may erect toll-bars, and appoint collectors on such road; and so soon as toll-bars shall be erected, the Trustees shall cause tables of the tolls to be collected on such road to be put up.

That the collectors shall pay the tolls by them collected, to the Trustees, who shall apply the same to the payment of the salaries of the surveyors and collectors, and of the interest on any monies which may have been borrowed for the making and repairing of such road.

That the Trustees shall cause correct accounts to be kept of all monies so received and disbursed by them, and such accounts shall be open at all times to the inspection of all persons interested therein.

That the several fines and penalties set forth in the Act 4 Wm. IV. No. 11, shall be enforced on persons committing similar offences on any road, made under the provisions of the pro-

posed Act, and shall be paid to the Trustees thereof, for the purposes of their trust.

The parties aggrieved by any such penalty, may appeal in manner pointed out by the said Act 4 Wm. IV. No. 11.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling's, dated 22nd September 1826, in favour of John Mills, whose interest therein was, it is alleged, sold by the Sheriff to Alexander Frazer, who sold to Isaac Simmons, who sold to claimant.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling's dated 4th December, 1830, in favour of William Rowe, now deceased, who sold to William Baisley, now deceased, who sold to claimant.

Case No. 718—Margaret Templeton, of Paterson's Plains, widow, by her attorney, William Grace, Esq.

One hundred acres, county of Durham, parish of *Middlehope* commencing at the north-west corner; and bounded on the north by a line running through a lagoon to Paterson's River, bearing east, by compass 34 chains; on the east by Paterson's River; on the south by Paterson's River, and a west line by compass of 9 chains; and on the west by a north line by compass of 25 chains, to the commencing north-west corner.

One hundred and thirty perches, county of Cumberland, parish of *St. John*, town of Parramatta, allotment No. 77, on the north side of George-street, in section No. 22; bounded on the west by a line 2 chains 77 links to the north boundary of No. 78 allotment; by that boundary 82 links by 25 links of the east line of No. 79 allotment to the south boundary of No. 18 Phillip-street; by that boundary 1 chain 14 links and by a line to Phillip-street 2 chains 91 links, on the north by Phillip-street, 88 links; on the east by a line 5 chains 93 links, to George-street; and on the south by George-street 1 chain 49 links.

This allotment was leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane, for 21 years from the 30th June 1823, to Sarah Peake, who, it is alleged, assigned it to her Son William Longford, now absent from the Colony, who sold to claimant, who requests a Deed on the condition of having erected buildings of £1000 value, as provided for by a clause in the lease.

Eighty acres, county of Cumberland, parish of *Menangle*, near the *Sugar-loaf*; commencing at the south-west corner of Thomas Taber, senior's grant of 100 acres; bounded on the north by a line bearing east 68 chains 40 links; on the east by a line south 14 chains and 50 links; on the south by a line east, 60 chains and 20 links; on the west by a line north, 10 chains and 50 links; again on the south by a line west, 8 chains and 50 links; and again on the west by a line north, 3 chains and 80 links.

This land was located on two orders of Governor Macquarie, for 40 acres each, in favour of James Horrox, deceased, whose representatives are to prove who is now entitled to the Deed of Grant.

Case No. 722—James Reynolds, of

by his Solicitor, Mr. G. R. Nichols; and William Charles, of ——— by his Solicitors, Messrs. Chambers and Holden.

Twenty-seven perches, County of Cumberland, town of Sydney, parish of *St. Phillip*, allotment No. 2, of section No. 79; bounded on the west by Cambridge-street, bearing south 21 degrees 30 minutes east 104½ links; then south 25 degrees east 59 links; on the south by allotments Nos. 3 and 10, bearing east 23 degrees north 60½ links; on the east by allotments Nos. 10, 11, 12, bearing north 30 degrees east 207½ links; and on the north by allotments Nos. 17 and 1 bearing west 13 degrees south 63 links; then south 14 degrees east 41 links; then west 20 degrees south 71¾ links.

This allotment formed the subject of Memorials, Nos. 859 and 860, of John Hull, preferred to the late Commission, but on which no deed issued. Hull is now deceased, and his heir-at-law and others, have, it would appear, sold to the present claimants, who will be required to name a common trustee, to whom the deed of grant may now issue.

Two roods thirty-one perches, county of Cumberland, parish of the *Field of Mars*, town of Parramatta; allotment of section No. 25,

bounded on the south by Bevan's allotment south 86 degrees west 239 links; on the west by a line north 25½ degrees west 318 links, on the north by a line east 200 links to the Windsor-road; and on the east by the Windsor-road south 31 degrees, east 320 links.

This description was inserted in the Gazette of the 12th January 1832, with a view to the preparation of a Deed of Grant, in the name of John McGovern, who was found in possession, and who, it is alleged, devised the land to trustees for the payment of his debts, who sold to John Tingcombe, who sold to claimant. It appears that this land includes two allotments, and that the one on the north was originally located to Matthew McElvoy, and that on the south to Joseph Willis. Case No. 724.—John Tingcombe and Francis Watkins, of Parramatta, merchants, by their Attorney, John Armitstead Esq.

Twenty six perches, County of Cumberland, parish of St. John, town of Parramatta, allotment No. 23, on the south side of Argyle-street in section No. 7; bounded on the west by a line 1 chain 77 links; on the south by a line 1 chain; on the east by a line to Argyle-street 1 chain 77 links, and on the north by that street 94 links.

This allotment was leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane for 21 years, from 30th June, 1823, to James Dawson, deceased, who, it is alleged, devised it to Sarah Ward Downes, who mortgaged it to claimants, who have foreclosed.

Case No. 725—George Clewitt, of Sydney, Statuary, Representatives of , by their Attorney, John Steel, Esq.

Sixteen perches, County of Cumberland, Town of Sydney, parish of St. James, portion of allotment No. 29 of section No. 31, viz., 29 acres; bounded on the east by Pitt-street, bearing north 7 degrees 30 minutes west 53½ links; on the north by allotment No. 15, bearing west 4 degrees 30 minutes south 179 links; on the west by allotments Nos. 10 and 11, bearing south 9 degrees 30 minutes east 62 links; and on the south by a line bearing east 8 degrees north 176 links.

Memorials for conterminous allotments were preferred to the old Commission by Torkington and Clewitt, now deceased, in opposition to Roach, and decided in favor of the opponents. Owing, however, to some error in the numbering, a Deed of Grant of Torkington's allotment was prepared for Clewitt and executed. Of this Deed Clewitt's representatives are required to make a surrender,

and likewise to prove who is now intitled to receive the Deed of Grant of the allotment above described. Case No. 726—John Terry Hughes, of Sydney, Merchant, opposed to H. J. Pilcher, of Maitland, Solicitor.

Thirty five acres, County of Northumberland, parish of Maitland, allotment No. 14, at Wallis' Plains; commencing at the north-west corner of allotment No 15 (Gaudry's), and bounded on the west by the east side of an occupation road bearing north 12 chains and north 14½ degrees west 15 chains and 75 links; on the north by 15 chains and 75 links of the south side of an occupation road, bearing east 2½ degrees north; on the east by 23 chains of the west boundary line of Luke Ralfe's land, bearing south; and on the south by the north boundary of allotment No. 15, bearing west 12 chains to the north-west corner of that allotment.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling's, dated 11th November, 1830, in favor of George Kay, now deceased. Hughes claims a Deed of Grant of the whole. Pilcher alleges, that Kay sold 10 acres of the land to James Blackenrigg, who sold to Thomas Stubbs, who sold to him (Pilcher.)

Case No. 727—William Henry Moore, of Castlereagh-street, Sydney, Solicitor.

Thirty-two perches, County of Cumberland, parish of St. John, Town of Parramatta, allotment No. 40, on the south side of Argyle-street in section 6; bounded on the west by a line 2 chains 15 links; on the South by a line 90 links; on the east by a line to Argyle-street 2 chains 15 links; and on the north by that street 90 links.

Twenty-six and one half perches, County of Cumberland, parish of St. John, Town of Parramatta, allotment No. 41, on the south side of Argyle-street, in section 6; bounded on the west by O'Connell-street 1 chain 41 links; on the south by a line 1 chain 18 links; on the east by a line to Argyle-street 40 links; and on the north by that street 1 chain 18 links.

These Allotments, it is alleged, were originally located by one Sainsbury, who sold to James Smith, who sold to Parson Yul, who sold to Kenyon, to whom they were leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane, for 21 years from the 30th June 1823, Kenyon sold to Mrs. Ann Drummond deceased, and her Executors sold to Claimant, who requests a Deed on payment of 21 years quit-rent.

Case No. 728.—John Macdonald of Pitt Town by his Solicitor Francis Beddek, Esq.

One hundred acres, County of Northumberland, parish of Warkworth; bounded on the west by Dight's Farm, bearing south 73 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 20 chains; on the east by a line bearing north to Hunter's River; and on the north by that River.

Sir Thomas Brisbane issued an order for 100 acres of Land on the 28th October 1823, in favor of Michael Griffin, now deceased, who, it is alleged, sold it to claimant, who selected the land. The description was inserted in the Gazette notice of 8th April 1830, page 411, in the name of the promisee.

Case No. 729.—Duncan M'Kellar, of St. Vincent County, Trustees of

Six hundred acres, County of Murray, parish unnamed, at *Jinglemoney*, opposite *Jembaicumbene*; bounded on the north by a line east 80 chains, commencing at the north east corner of Duncan M'Kellar's additional grant; on the east by a line south 9 chains to the Shoalhaven River, and thence by that River; on the south by a line west 80 chains; and on the west by Duncan M'Kellar's aforesaid additional grant, north 80 chains.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling's, dated 21st September, 1827, in favour of Duncan M'Kellar, now deceased, who, it is alleged, devised it to Trustees, viz:—John Coghill of Kirkham, James M'Farlane of Invertooly, David Coghill of Bida Vale, and Thomas Brown of Sydney, one of whom, Thomas Brown, has relinquished the trust. The description was inserted in the Gazette Notice of 18th of May 1830, page 603 in the name of the promisee.

Case No. 730, George Cox, M. D. of Illawarra, opposed by Mary Martin of Wollongong.
