PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation, bearing date the twenty-first day of May, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, issued in pursuance of an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act further to restrain the unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands, and to provide the means of defraying the expense of a Border Police," the Crown Lands of this Colony, adjacent to, and beyond the limits at present allotted for location, were divided into nine districts, one of which, numbered nine, and designated the PORT PHILLIP DISTRICT, was described as comprising the whole of the lands in the district lying to the south of the main range, between the rivers Owens and Goulburn, and adjacent to Port Phillip," and whereas it is found expedient to divide the same, NOW, THEREFORE, I, the GOVERNOR aforesaid, in virtue of the authority in me vested by the above recited Act, do hereby proclaim that the said district has been divided into two districts, and the following are the boundaries of the same respectively, namely—

No. 9. WESTERN PORT DISTRICT, bounded on the north-east by the main range between the River Owens and the Goulburn, otherwise Bayangan, which divides it from the Morumbidgee District, No. 7, and extending south to Bass's Straits; on the east by the Australian Alps, dividing it from the Maneroo District, No. 8; and on the west by the Weariby River and a line in continuation of the direction thereof north-westerly towards the Australian Pyrenees.

No. 10. PORTLAND BAY DISTRICT, bounded on the east by the Weariby River and a line in continuation of the direction thereof north-westerly towards the Australian Pyrenees, and embracing the whole country to the west as far as South Australia.

Given under my hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this first day of July, One

thousand eight hundred and forty, in the fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

THE GOVERNOR, with reference to His Excellency's Proclamation of this date, has been pleased to appoint the following Gentlemen to be Commissioners of Crown Lands beyond the boundaries of location, under the Act of the Governor and Council, 2nd Victoriae, No. 27, intituled, "An Act further to restrain the unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands, and to provide the means of defraying the expense of a Border Police;"—and directs that the towns at which they are severally to be addressed be also notified, namely:—

No. 9. WESTERN PORT District, FREDERICK ALMOND POWLETT, Esquire, Post Town, Melbourne, Port Phillip.

No. 10. PORTLAND BAY District, FOSTER FYANS, Esquire, Geelong, Port Phillip.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct that the following ORDER IN COUNCIL be republished from the London Gazette, for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,

At the Court at Windsor, the 9th day of December, 1839.

PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas by an Act passed in the first and second year of Her present Majesty intituled, "An Act to amend the Laws of the Customs," after reciting that by an Act passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to carry

into effect a convention of commerce concluded between His Majesty and the United States of America, and a treaty with the Prince Regent of Portugal," divers provisions were made respecting the duties payable, and the bounties and allowances to be granted upon the importation and exportation of goods, wares, and merchandise, into or from the United Kingdom in vessels of the United States and in Portuguese vessels, and respecting the repayment to certain corporations, bodies, politic and corporate, and sundry other persons, of the amount of the sums of money, of which they would be deprived by means of the said Act; and it was thereby enacted that the said Act should continue in force so long as the convention therein recited between His said Majesty and the United States of America, and the treaty therein recited between His said Majesty and His Royal Highness the Prince Regent of Portugal, and so long as any treaty to be made with any foreign power, with the similar provisions therein before recited should respectively continue in force, and also reciting, that, subsequently to the enactment of the said recited Act, Her Majesty and Her Royal Predecessors have made and concluded with divers foreign powers, treaties, containing provisions, similar to those recited in the said recited Acts, and doubts have arisen whether, according to the true construction thereof, the said Act doth apply and extend to the trade and shipping of such other foreign powers; and it is expedient that such doubts be removed; it is thereby enacted and declared, that from and after the ratification of any treaty heretofore made by Her Majesty or any of Her Royal Predecessors, subsequently to the enactment of the said Act, or of any treaty which may hereafter be made by Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, with any such foreign power, in which treaty has been or shall be contained provisions similar to those contained in the said recited Act, all and every, the provisions, clauses, matters, and things in the said recited act contained, do and shall apply and extend to the trade and shipping of such foreign powers respectively, as fully and effectually to all intents and purposes as to the trade and shipping of the said United States and of the said Kingdom of Portugal.

And for the prevention of uncertainty therein it is thereby enacted that it shall and may be lawful for Her Majesty, her Heirs and Successors by any Order or Orders to be by Her or them made, with the advice of Her or their Privy Council, and published in the *London Gazette* from time to time to declare what are the foreign powers with which any such treaty or treaties as aforesaid, is or are subsisting; and that such Act and the said recited Act shall apply and shall be deemed from the time of the ratification of any such treaties, to have been applicable to the trade and shipping of such foreign countries, as shall be so mentioned in any such Order or Orders in Council as aforesaid, so long as any such Order or Orders shall continue unrevoked, and no longer.

Now therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authority in Her vested by the Act so passed as aforesaid, in the first and second year of Her reign, declare, that the foreign powers with which any such treaties as aforesaid are subsisting, are the several powers

hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, the United States of America, His Majesty the King of Prussia, His Majesty the King of Hanover, His Majesty the King of Denmark, the United Provinces of Rio de la Plata, the State of Colombia, the Senate of the free Hanseatic City of Lubeck, the Senate of the Free Hanseatic City of Bremen, and the Senate of the Free Hanseatic City of Hamburg, His Majesty the King of the French, His Majesty the King of Sweden and Norway, the United States of Mexico, His Majesty the Emperor of Brazil, the Free City of Frankfort, the State of Venezuela, the Peru Bolivian Confederation, His Majesty the King of Greece, His Majesty the King of the Netherlands, His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, and the Sultan of the Ottoman Empire.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, are to give the necessary directions hereiu accordingly.

NEW ZEALAND.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the re-publication of the following Proclamations, issued by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand, declaring the full Sovereignty of the Islands of New Zealand to be vested in Her Majesty QUEEN VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland. By WILLIAM HOBSON, Esquire, a Captain in the Royal Navy, Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand.

WHEREAS, by a Treaty bearing date the fifth day of February, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty, made and executed by me, WILLIAM HOBSON, a Captain in the Royal Navy, Consul, and Lieutenant-Governor in New Zealand, vested for this purpose with full powers by Her Britannic Majesty, of the one part, and the Chiefs of the Confederation of the United Tribes of New Zealand, and the separate and Independent Chiefs of New Zealand, not Members of the Confederation, of the other; and further ratified and confirmed by the adherence of the Principal Chiefs of this Island of New Zealand, commonly called "the Northern Island"; all Rights and Powers of Sovereignty over the said Northern Island were ceded to Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain and Ireland, absolutely and without reservation.

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM HOBSON, Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand, in the name and on the behalf of Her Majesty, do hereby Proclaim and Declare, to all Men, that from and after the date of the above mentioned Treaty, the full Sovereignty of the Northern Island of New Zealand, vests in Her Majesty Queen VICTORIA, Her Heirs and Successors for ever.

Given under my Hand at Government-house, Russell, Bay of Islands, this twenty-first

day of May, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN.

PROCLAMATION.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland. By William Hobson, Esquire, a Captain in the Royal Navy, Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand.

WHEREAS I have in command from Her Majesty Queen VICTORIA, through her Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, to assert, on the grounds of Discovery, the Sovereign Rights of Her Majesty over the Southern Islands of New Zealand, commonly called "the Middle Island," and "Stewart's Island"; and the Island commonly called "the Northern Island," having been ceded in Sovereignty to Her Majesty.

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM HOBSON, Lieutenant Governor of New Zealand, do hereby Proclaim and Declare to all Men, that from and after the date of these Presents, the full Sovereignty of the Islands of New Zealand, extending from thirty-four degrees thirty minutes to forty-seven degrees ten minutes south latitude, and between one hundred and sixty-six degrees five minutes to one hundred and seventy-nine degrees of east longitude, vests in Her Majesty Queen VICTORIA, Her Heirs and Successors for ever.

POSTAGE.

WHEREAS the 4th clause of the Colonial Post Office Act, 5th William IV., No. 24, provides, "That nothing herein contained shall be taken to authorize any charge for postage, upon any letter or packet, addressed to, or franked by any person in Great Britain or Ireland, being empowered by law to send or receive letters or packets beyond the sea, free from postage." And whereas, by a minute issued by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated Lon-

don, 26th December, 1839, and a notice from the Secretary to the Postmaster-General, of the same date, it has been brought under the notice of His Excellency the Governor, that the privilege of franking and receiving letters free would entirely cease in Great Britain from the 10th of January last.

His Excellency therefore directs it to be intimated, that letters or parcels addressed to public officers, or departments in England, will not pass free through the Sydney Post Office unless they be franked by some person authorized under existing regulations to receive and send letters free of postage in and from this Colony.

His Excellency has further directed, that for the present, and until further directions shall be issued on the subject, all letters from public departments in England, or from officers formerly allowed to frank, will be allowed to pass free through the Sydney Post Office.

DESCRIPTION.

Dark bay Mare, supposed to be in foal, faint star on the forehead, three black legs, the near hind fetlock white, long tail, two white saddle-marks, about fifteen hands high.

Brown Pony, cropped ears, hog mane, small star on forehead, fired in both fore legs, fetlock joint of the off hind leg much enlarged, several white saddle-marks on both sides, white spot on the rump bone near side, small white spot in the lower part of the neck on the off side.

Dark bay Horse, four black legs, high between the rump and withers, small faint white spot centre of forehead, same over the off eye, white saddle-marks on both sides.
