NOTICE TO MARINERS.

BEACON ON THE WOLFE ROCK.

Trinity House, London,

July 21, 1840.

THE CORPORATION of Trinity House have much satisfaction in stating, for the information of Masters of Vessels, and Mariners in general, that the difficult and hazardous works, which have, during the last four summers, been

in operation, under their direction, for constructing a beacon upon that dangerous rock called the Wolfe, situate about $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles W.S.W. of the Land's End of Cornwall, have been completed, and that a conspicuous beacon has been erected thereon.

This beacon consists of an artificial cone, bearing a mast, having a large ball upon its summit, at an elevation of thirty-six feet above the level of the sea at high water; and Mariners are to observe, that spring tides rise at this station nineteen feet, and that at low water of those tides the rock is uncovered to the height of fifteen feet.

The bearings and distances of the undermentioned objects from this beacon are as follows, viz:—

Longship's Light House, N.E. N. by distant $7\frac{3}{4}$ miles.

Scilly Light House, W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. distant 21 miles.

Rundlestone Rock, which covers at half flood, E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. distant 7 miles.

Seven Stones, centre thereof, N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. distant $13\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

Lizard Light Houses, S.E. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., distant 23 miles.

It being of great importance that this beacon should not sustain injury, Masters of Vessels and others are hereby cautioned and enjoined, not to approach it on any consideration, lest their own safety, as well as the security of the structure, should be thereby unnecessarily endangered.

CENSUS FOR THE YEAR 1841.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs the Publication, for general Information, of the following Circular Letter and Instructions, which have been issued for collecting the Census for the year 1841.

COPY.—(CIRCULAR.)

REFERRING to my Letter of the 12th inst., I now do myself the honor to transmit for your information and guidance, a supply of FORMS

OF RETURN, prescribed by the Act of Council, 4 VICTORIA, No 26, together with Instructions for filling up the same, and am directed by His Excellency the GOVERNOR to request that you will appoint proper persons to collect the prescribed information, in compliance with the 2nd Section of the Act, and afterwards cause the Returns to be correctly filled up, as required by the same Section; deposited and sworn to as directed by the 3rd Section; and ultimately examined and transmitted to me, together with an Abstract thereof in the form C, as enjoined in the 4th Section.

If the supply of Forms now sent to you should be found to be insufficient, you will be pleased to let me know as quickly as convenient how many more you are likely to require of each; but, if more than sufficient for your District, you will have the goodness to return them to be sent elsewhere.

I have also to request that you will report, as soon as determined, the names of the Collectors appointed by you, and the rate of Allowance proposed to be paid to them; which must not, of course, exceed the amount specified in the 6th section.

In order to insure greater accuracy in obtaining the Information required, the Collectors should be previously instructed in the nature of their Duties, and the mode of filling up the Returns should be distinctly explained to them. No one should be appointed in this capacity, who is not possessed of the requisite Intelligence and steadiness of Character to perform the duty efficiently.

The Limits of the respective Districts are defined in the Notice inserted in the *Government Gazette* of 12th August last, and should be observed as far as practicable; but I beg to point out, that of the two evils, it will be better that the same person be reported by the Collectors of more than one District, than that any person, however remote or small his establishment, should be omitted.—In the former case the error can be afterwards rectified in this Office, but, in the latter, there will be no remedy.

You will observe that, as the Returns are to be numbered in regular Series, for each County, Parish, Town, or District, and as several Collectors will, probably, be employed at the same time in different parts of the same District, it will be necessary, in order to ensure the required Regularity, that the Return brought in by each Collector be numbered by the Justices previously to administering the prescribed Affidavits; and, that the contents of each individual Return form a separate line in the Printed Abstract C; and that a separate Abstract be furnished for each County, or Parish in the County of Cumberland, Town or reputed Town or District, as particularly defined in the 4th section of the Act.

In addition, I believe it is only necessary to remind you, that the day appointed for naming Collectors is the 15th February; for commencing the filling up of the Returns, the 2nd of March; for depositing them with the Justices, and making Affidavits, the 16th of March; for transmitting the Returns after examination, and Certificates to this Office, the 1st of June; and that so much importance has the Legislature attached to the

duties entrusted to the Magistrates in this matter, that a failure or neglect in the performance of them, subjects the party concerned to the fine of Fifty Pounds.

CENSUS FOR THE YEAR 1841.

I NSTRUCTIONS for filling up the Returns for the Census of the year 1841, as prescribed by the Act of the Governor in Council, 4th VICTORIA, No. 26.

1.—The Forms which have been printed for this purpose are to be sent round by the persons appointed by the Magistrates, by whom, as well as by the respective Householders, who can write, each Form is to be signed when duly filled up.

2.—In filling up these Returns, the persons appointed to perform this duty will studiously avoid every thing likely to give offence, in putting Questions necessary to obtain the Information required by the Act.

3.—The Printed Forms are to be numbered in regular series, for each County, Parish, Town or District, and great care must be taken, both that none of the Numbers are lost, and that in the letter transmitting them to the Colonial Secretary, when completed, it be specified how many of them are forwarded.

4.—When the Abstract C may consist of more than one Sheet, the whole should be tied together at one corner, and the Tape, with which they are secured, carefully sealed.

5.—When completed, agreeably to the foregoing Directions, the whole are to be returned with as little delay as possible, and not later than the 1st of June, to the Colonial Secretary, accompanied by a List shewing the Names of the Districts, and the Number of Returns for each District.

LAND.—PORT PHILLIP.

WITH reference to the Government Notice of the 21st ultimo, respecting the disposal of Crown Lands in the Southern or Port Phillip District,—His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that the following PORTIONS OF LAND in that District, which have been previously advertised at upset prices not exceeding twenty shillings an acre, will, on and after the 1st day of March next, be open to selection at the fixed price of twenty shillings an acre, in the manner pointed out in the above notice.

QUALITIES OF THE SUPPLIES.

1 All the articles shall be of the best quality of their several kinds.

2. The Bread shall be the produce of clean, sound Colonial Wheat, Barley and Maize, from which, on the Military Ration 20 per cent., and on the Convict Ration 10 per cent., has been extracted in bran and waste. The Wheaten Bread shall be made in loaves of 3lbs., and the Mixed Bread in loaves of 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. each, and baked 24 hours before being issued.

3.
