FEMALE ORPHAN SCHOOL.

POLICE DISTRICTS.

WITH reference to the Notice of the 12th August, 1840, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that it has been found expedient to make a slight alteration in the dividing line between the Police Districts of Campbelltown and Picton, hitherto known and notified as Stonequarry; amended descriptions of which are subjoined.

4. CAMPBELLTOWN.

Embracing the southern portion of the County of Cumberland, and a north-eastern portion of the County of Camden; consisting of the Hundreds of Southend and Campbelltown, and the Parishes of Cook in the Hundred of Bringelly, and Heathcote, and Bulga, in the Hundred of Wattamolla, and a part of the County of Camden; bounded on the north from Wattamollo by a line bearing north-westerly to a northern boundary of John Lucas, grant on Woronora Creek, thence by a line bearing westerly, crossing Dead Man's Creek, George's River, Boro-Bowing, and Bunberry Curran Creeks, to the cross cut road on the Campbelltown Road, and by this cross road to the Cowpasture old road, to the junction of the Bringelly Road, thence by the Bringelly Road to Bringelly Creek, and by that Creek to the Nepean River; on the west by the Nepean River to five miles south of the confluence of the Cordian River, thence on the south by a line bearing east to the source of the Cordian River, and foot of the Illawarra Range; on the east by part of this range bearing northerly to the source of the Cataract River; thence by a line east to the sea shore near Bulli, which is the eastern boundary to Wattamollo aforesaid.

IT appearing to His Excellency the GOVERNOR, that much mischief may arise from the Sale of the fire arms, or other weapons and ammunition, taken by the Police from Bushrangers, or Prisoners illegally at large; His EXCELLENCY directs it to be notified, that in future all such articles will be advertised in the *Government Gazette*, for one Month, for the purpose of giving the rightful owner an opportunity of identifying and claiming his property, and that at the expiration of that time, such of the articles as may be suitable for the Police, and not claimed, will be

appropriated to that service, and the remainder destroyed, under the orders of the Police Magistrate, or Bench where there is no such Officer. All housebreaking instruments, or other articles also which are adapted to be used for any illegal purpose, are to be in like manner immediately destroyed.

The Police Magistrates, and Benches, are accordingly requested, in transmitting to the Colonial Secretary the lists of articles in possession of the Police intended for Sale, to furnish at the same time separate lists of the arms, ammunition, or other articles which it would be improper to sell, specifying such as, if not claimed, they would propose to appropriate to the service of the Police, and such as they would recommend to be destroyed.

It is requested that *within three months* from the present date, the particulars required by the Government Notice of the 1st October, 1838, may be accurately furnished to this Office, viz:—

Surname and all Christian names of the person in whose favor the Deed is to be prepared, written at full length, his residence, and the intended name of the property.

SPECIAL SURVEYS—PORT PHILLIP.

WITH reference to the Notices from this Office, dated the 5th December, 1840, and 21st January, 1841, detailing the mode in which ordinary purchases of Crown Lands are to be effected in the PORT PHILLIP District, His Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the following Regulations respecting SPECIAL SURVEYS in that District.

1. Any holder of a Land Receipt to the extent of not less than 5120 acres may, if he think fit, demand a Special Survey of any Land, not hereinafter excepted, within the District of Port Phillip, whether such Land Receipt be obtained in the manner pointed out in the Government Notice of the 21st January last, or granted by the Colonial Land and Emigration Commissioners, in London.

2. Any person who may desire to have a Special Survey must deliver his Land Receipt to the Senior Surveyor resident at Melbourne, describing at the same time, the Land which he is desirous of having; and in doing this, he must not only give a general description of the Land, but must be prepared when called on to point out to a Government Surveyor the exact spot on the ground itself from which the Survey is to commence, or by which it is to be regulated. All such selections must be made by sealed Tender, in the same form and manner as directed in the 4th paragraph

of the Regulations of 21st January, 1841, with respect to Lands already surveyed and open to Sale.

3. The Land for which a Special Survey may be required must always consist of a regular unbroken area or block of Land, within a continued boundary. The block can never contain more than the following proportion of frontage measured upon any River, Watercourse, Lake, or other boundary, which by the custom of the Colony, has hitherto been, or may reasonably be, considered water-frontage,—that is to say, not more than the proportion of one mile of such frontage for every four square miles of area, the frontage, however, being measured in the usual way, and not made to follow the sinuosities of Coasts or Rivers. If both sides of the River or other boundary be taken, each side will reckon as water-frontage, and the other boundaries fixed by any Special Survey, must be straight lines running from north to south, and from east to west, and must coincide, as far as possible, with the ordinary Section lines of the Colony, in all situations where such Section lines may have been established.

4. No Land which may have been surveyed and proclaimed open to selection by ordinary Purchasers, on or before the day on which a selection may have been made for a Special Survey, can be included in such Special Survey.

5. No Land whatever within five miles of any of the Towns of Melbourne, Geelong, Williamstown, or Portland, can be included within the limits of a Special Survey; all such Lands having, in pursuance of the recommendation of the Executive Council, been already reserved from sale, and the instructions of Her Majesty's Government sought as to the way in which they are to be disposed of.

6. In determining the order to be observed in granting Special Surveys, the Government will be guided by the same rules as are established by the Public Notice of the 21st January last, for giving priority in the selection of Lands for purchase:—that is to say, when the descriptions of any Lands asked for as Special Surveys be lodged on the same day, the holder of the Land Receipt of the earliest number and date will be entitled to priority; but if the descriptions be lodged on different days, priority in the lodging of the descriptions will alone be considered in fixing the precedence of the Special Survey. The mere lodging with the Senior Officer of the Surveyor General's Department, of a demand for a Special Survey, unaccompanied by a description of the Lands asked for, will give no precedence.

7. The usual right of opening roads through any part of the land will be reserved to the Crown, but no other reservations whatever will be inserted in the Deeds of Grant.

8. Her Majesty having directed that Reserves shall be made of sites for Towns likely to be the seats of a local administration of Government, or sites on good harbours, which may be expected to become considerable Sea-ports, it is to be distinctly understood that if, on examination of the locality in which a Special Survey may be demanded, it shall appear that any land proper to be reserved for such purposes is included within the proposed limits, a reservation of such land will be

made to the extent which may be requisite for giving effect to the above instructions.

ADDITIONAL RULES and REGULATIONS, for the George-street Market, Sydney, with reference to those of the 22nd February, 1840, under the Act of the Governor and Council, 4 William IV., No. 7, Sec. 64.

Rule 19.—Every person being detected sweeping or putting any dirt or rubbish in the centre gutter of either of the Markets, or any part adjacent thereto, after the same shall have been swept, or on the Market days, or who shall neglect or refuse to cleanse, by sweeping and throwing on the floor of their Stalls not less than six gallons of water, upon the Mornings on which the Markets are swept by the Lessee, and before the ringing of the bell, shall forfeit and pay for each offence, the sum of not less than Ten Shillings, nor more than One Pound.

Rule 20.—Every Person selling live Poultry in the Market, shall be required to have Coops, in which to keep the said Poultry, eighteen inches above the flags, supported by legs with rail bottoms, and no such Poultry or roasting Pigs to be allowed loose in any stall or stalls, or suffered to remain all night in the Market. Any Person infringing this rule, shall forfeit and pay the sum of not less than Ten Shillings nor more than One Pound. (This regulation not to apply to the Market Building letter A.)
