HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the publication of the following letter from His Honor the Superintendent of Port Phillip, dated Melbourne, 8th March, 1841, reporting that several articles have been found on the Coast, between Portland Bay and Port Fairy, which indicate the wreck of some vessel, supposed to have been a French Whaler, in some part of Bass's Straits.

Melbourne, 8th March, 1841.

SIR,—I have received a communication dated 17th February, from the Police Magistrate of Portland, that in consequence of a report having reached him, that divers articles, indicative of a wreck, had been found upon the Coast, between Portland Bay and Port Fairy, he judged it his duty to proceed with a party in search, and that he had returned from Port Fairy, after ascertaining that the vessel, wherever it may have foundered, was in all probability a French Whaler. It is supposed that she had been lost somewhere in the Straits, at a considerable distance from the Coast,—candles in great quantities, and other portions of the wreck, being strewed along the shores to the extent of fifty miles.

From the quantity of barnacles adhering to the articles found, it is supposed that she had been a considerable time under water before she broke up. A page of a French Nautical Almanac, 1838, and a compass, by Devot of Havre, and vast quantities of wax candles of peculiar foreign make, were the principal articles found.
