NOTICE TO MARINERS.

LIGHT-HOUSE ON THE MAPLIN SAND.

Trinity-House, London, January 14, 1841.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the light-house, which has been for some time past in course of erection upon the Maplin Sand, is nearly completed; and that the light therein will be exhibited, for the first time, on the evening of Wednesday, the 10th February next; at which time the light, hitherto shewn on board of a vessel moored off that Sand, will be discontinued, and the vessel taken away.

Mariners are to observe, that this light-house is erected upon the south eastern projecting part of the Sand, where it becomes dry, or nearly so, at low water spring tides; and they are particularly cautioned and enjoined never, under any circumstances, either by night or by day, to attempt to cross the Sand to the northward of the building.

Mariners are also to observe that, in this light-house, a fixed light, coloured red, and visible in all directions, will be exhibited.
