In the Equitable Jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of New South Wales.—Third Term, 1841.

It is Ordered:—That the Guardians of the Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified,

Estates and Persons of Infants, Wards of this Court, and the Committees of the Persons and Estates of Lunatics, and the Receivers of the Rents and Profits of Estates under the Care of this Court, do duly and annually pass their accounts before the Master in Equity of this Court, and do pay what they receive, according to the terms of the Orders under which they are appointed; and that the Master in Equity of this Court do, upon the first day of the first Term, in the Year one thousand eight hundred and fortytwo, and upon the first day of the first Term in every succeeding Year, certify to the Equity Judge, for the time being, the state of the several Guardians, Committees, and Receivers' Accounts, in his Office, and the several times when they have respectively passed their Accounts in his Office, and also do state the names of the respective Guardians, Committees, and Receivers, who have neglected to pass their respective Accounts within the period aforesaid, in order that His Honor may direct proceedings to be taken against the said respective parties, to compel obedience of this Order. And it is further Ordered, That this Order be forthwith entered with the Master, and Copies thereof be set up in the Office belonging to this Court.

A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

HEREAS it has been represented to the Government that a Verdict of Wilful Murder has been returned against one Denis Shea, by a Coroner's Inquest, held at Clarence Town, in June last, on the remains of the body of James Greig, of that District, who is supposed to have been Shot by the said Denis Shea, and whereas a Warrant has been issued by J. Parker, Esq., the Coroner, against the said Denis Shea, who has absconded, and is still at large;—His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified,

that with a view to the offender being more speedily brought to justice, a Reward of Twenty-five Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who shall apprehend and lodge the said Denis Shea in any of Her Majesty's Gaols; and that if he be apprehended and secured by a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.

## A CONDITIONAL PARDON.
