THE GOVERNOR having laid before the Executive Council, a resolution adopted at a Public Meeting of the Inhabitants of Melbourne, held on the 21st January, 1841, in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Colonial Legislature, 3rd VICTORIA, No. 19, in favour of establishing a Market within the said Town; His Excellency directs it to be notified, with the advice of the said Council, that He has approved of the establishment of a Market at Melbourne, accordingly.

In the Equitable Jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of New South Wales .- Third Term, 1841.

TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD,

A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

HEREAS it has been represented to the Government that a Verdict of Wilful Murder has been returned against one Denis Shea, by a Coroner's Inquest, held at Clarence Town, in June last, on the remains of the body of James Greig, of that District, who is supposed to have been Shot by the said Denis Shea, and whereas a Warrant has been issued by J. Parker, Esq., the Coroner, against the said Denis Shea, who has absconded, and is still at large; - His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that with a view to the offender being more speedily brought to justice, a Reward of Twenty-five Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who shall apprehend and lodge the said Denis Shea in any of Her Majesty's Gaols; and that if he be apprehended and secured by a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.
