HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to
direct that the general objects of the
following Bills, now under consideration of the
Legislative Council, be published for general
information.

*By His Excellency's Command,

*No. 1.—“ A Bill to amend, and to extend to Port
Phillip, an Act intituled, ‘ An Act to consolidate
and amend the laws relating to the Savings’
Bank of New South Wales.’ ”*

It being expedient to amend the Act 3 VICTORIA,
No. 12, and to extend the provisions thereof, as
so amended, to a Savings' Bank to be established
at Port Phillip, it is proposed:—

That a Savings' Bank shall be established at
Port Phillip, to be called “ THE SAVINGS' BANK
OF PORT PHILLIP,” the management whereof
shall be distinct from, and independent of, the
Savings' Bank of New South Wales.

That His Honor the Superintendent of Port
Phillip shall be the President of the said Insti-
tution, and that the management of the affairs
thereof shall be vested in Twelve Trustees, to be
appointed by the said Superintendent, of whom
one shall be styled Vice-President.

That the Act 3 VICTORIA, No. 12, shall extend
and apply to the said Institution to be established
at Port Phillip.

That the said Act shall be amended by providing
for the establishment of a Rest or Security Fund
in each Bank.

That the said Act shall be further amended by
providing, in the event of the Insolvency, or death
of any Officer of the said Banks respectively, for
the recovery of such Money, Deeds, or Securities,
belonging to such Banks respectively, as may have
been in the possession of such Officer at the time
of his Bankruptcy or death.

*No. 2.—A Bill to amend the law for the Trans-
portation of Offenders to Penal Settlements, and
to provide for and regulate the Transportation
of Offenders to Van Diemen's Land, and the
Islands adjacent thereto, and comprised within
the Government thereof.*

The places heretofore used as Penal Settlements
for the Colony of New South Wales, being no longer
used as such, and His Excellency the Governor hav-
ing, by virtue of the authority vested in the several
Governors of Her Majesty's Colonial Possessions,
under an Act of Parliament, passed in the Sixth
year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, and

an order in Council, bearing date 22nd May, 1840, issued a Proclamation, declaring that the Colony of Van Diemen's Land, and the Islands adjacent thereto, and under the Government thereof, shall be used as places of Transportation for Transported offenders under Colonial sentence of Transportation; it is proposed to repeal so much of 3 William IV., No. 3, as enacts that Transported offenders, under Colonial sentence or order of Transportation, shall be Transported to such Penal Settlements within the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies, as the Governor for the time being of the said Colony should direct.

That after sentence passed on any such offender, the Governor may order him to be kept to hard labour at such place as he shall think fit, until his removal to the place of Transportation.

That in all cases where any such offender, already under sentence or order of Transportation passed in any of Her Majesty's Dominions, shall be convicted of an offence for which a sentence of Transportation may be passed, it shall be lawful to pass on such offender a sentence of Transportation for life, or for any term not less than seven years, provided that the term of such sentence shall in no case exceed, in the whole, the duration of sentence to which a free and untransported person would for such offence be liable, in addition to the duration or residue of the term of the original sentence of such Transported offender.

Nothing in the proposed Act to repeal or alter the Act 3 Victoria, No. 22, abolishing the Transportation of Female Convicts.

ADDRESS.

THE following Address from the Magistrates, Civil Officers, and Inhabitants of Auckland, was received by his Excellency the GOVERNOR, on the 22nd instant:—

To His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS,
Knight, Captain General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales, &c. &c. &c.

SIR,—HER MAJESTY having been graciously pleased to erect the Islands of New Zealand into a separate Colony, We, the undersigned, the Magistrates, Civil Officers, and Inhabitants of Auckland, are desirous to avail ourselves of the earliest opportunity, since the dissolution of our connection with your Administration, to testify our grateful sense of the interest you have on all occasions manifested towards this rising settlement, and our acknowledgment of the excellent judgment displayed in all your measures relating to it, so long as it continued under your Government.

We believe that the power of Legislation which Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to grant, will be highly beneficial to this Colony, by affording more ready and immediate modes of meeting the various wants and exigencies incidental to a new Colony; but, whilst gratefully receiving this proof of Her Majesty's regard for the welfare of one of Her most remote possessions, We are at the same time fully sensible how great and important is the assistance we have received from the Colony of New South Wales, under your enlightened Administration, and though severed from Our legal

connexion with it, We yet trust, that community of interests and reciprocity of advantages may afford increased and frequent facility of intercourse, and connect by the closest ties the two Colonies

We avail ourselves of this opportunity to add, that the experience we have enjoyed of your zealous and watchful care for the protection and promotion of our interests, is an assurance and pledge to us that in your Excellency we shall always find every desire and endeavour to continue the same course of encouragement to the equal benefit and prosperity of both Colonies.

The following Answer has been returned to the Gentlemen who signed the Address, through His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand:—

Government House,

Sydney, 22nd August, 1841.

SIR,—I have this day had the honor to receive the Address from the Magistrates, Civil Officers, and Inhabitants of Auckland, which your Excellency kindly undertook to convey to my hands.

I beg, through your Excellency, to return to the Gentlemen who concurred in this Address, my sincere thanks for the honor they have done me, and to express to them the satisfaction which I feel, in finding that my anxious desire to advance the interests of New Zealand, during the time it formed part of my Government, is acknowledged and appreciated by them.

The annexation of New Zealand to New South Wales, was a measure of temporary convenience only;—when circumstances no longer required so close a connexion, no one rejoiced more than myself to see New Zealand advanced to the station which it now holds amongst Her Majesty's Colonial possessions; nor does any one, I beg to assure both your Excellency and the Gentlemen who have addressed me, desire more ardently than I do, to see New Zealand prosper under your Excellency's Administration, and to see also the ties growing out of contiguity which connect it with this Colony, daily increased and strengthened.

OCCUPATION OF CROWN LANDS WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES.

WITH reference to the Regulations of 1st August, 1831, 25th September, 1839, and 13th February, 1840, relative to the Leasing of Crown Lands within the Boundaries of Location, and to the 6th clause in the Act of Council, 5 VICTORIA, No. 1, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that it having been found inconvenient to issue Annual Leases in the manner pointed out in the said Regulations, it is proposed,

in future, instead of Annual Leases, to grant Licenses to Depasture Cattle and other Stock in lieu thereof.

The said Regulations have accordingly been cancelled so far as they apply to the Leases in question, and the following are to be substituted for them:—

1st. The Land for the occupation of which Licenses may be obtained, will be advertised from time to time in the *Government Gazette*.

2nd. Persons wishing to have particular Lands advertised, may apply, as heretofore, to the Surveyor General, for that purpose.

3rd. No Lot, consisting of less than one square mile, or 640 acres, will be put up, except in special cases, which may render expedient a departure from this rule: And in any case where there is a broken section with water frontage, the section behind it will be added to the Lot.

4th. The upset price of each Lot will be specified in the advertisement; the bidding will be upon this upset price, and the Lot will be knocked down to the highest bidder. The Government, however reserves to itself the right of refusing the bidding of any one; and before any bidding is accepted, if the yearly price of the License does not exceed £5, the same will be demanded at the fall of the hammer, but if above £5, a deposit of ten per cent. will be required at the fall of the hammer, and the balance to be paid within one month from the day of sale.

5th. Parties failing to pay the balance within that period, will forfeit the deposit of ten per cent., and will of course acquire no right to the occupancy of the Land intended to have been included in the License.

6th. Immediately upon payment of the full amount for the License, the same will be issued by the Colonial Treasurer, in the form annexed.

7th. It is to be distinctly understood, that the Lands included in any such License, will be open to purchase under the ordinary Regulations; and in the event of their being sold, must be surrendered by the party upon his receiving one month's notice; but in such case, the balance of the price of the License for the time it has to run, will be refunded to him.

8th. Parties holding Lands under License, in conformity with these Regulations, will be entitled to the exclusive right of occupancy of the same, during the period the License shall remain in force, for the purpose of Depasturing Cattle and other Stock; but a clause will be inserted in it, restraining the holder from cutting Cedar or other Timber, except such of the latter as may be required for domestic uses, for firebote, fencing stock-yards, or other conveniences, for the enjoyment of the Land, provided that no part thereof be sold.

9th. In the District of Port Phillip, Licenses will be issued by the Sub-Treasurer of the District, in the same form and manner, and subject to the same formalities, in all respects, as Licenses in the Sydney District; and persons desiring to have any particular portions of Land advertised, may make application for them to the Senior Surveyor of the District.

FORM OF LICENSE REFERRED TO.

License to Depasture Crown Lands within the Limits of Location.

WHEREAS, by the Act of the Governor and Council, 5 Victoria, No. 1, it is amongst other things enacted, that no person occupying Crown Lands, within the limits prescribed for Location to Settlers, having a valid License for the occupation of the same, signed by the Colonial Treasurer, for the time being, of the said Colony, or such other Officer or Officers as the Governor shall appoint, shall be liable to any penalty, under the Act of Council, 2 Victoria, No. 27, as the same is continued and amended by the former Act, for occupying such Lands contrary to the provisions of the same; and whereas, on the day of _____, 18____, an Annual License for the occupation of the Crown Land herein-after described, was put up to Auction, when _____ of _____ was declared the highest bidder, at the sum of _____, and whereas he has since duly paid into my hands the said sum.

Now, therefore, I, in pursuance of the authority vested in me, do hereby License the said _____ to Depasture Cattle and other Stock upon the said Land, which is described as follows:— _____ acres, in the county of _____, parish of _____, bounded, &c.

_____ : Provided, however, that the holder of this License shall not be entitled, by virtue of the same, to cut Cedar or other Timber, growing upon the said Land, except such of the latter as may be required for domestic uses, for fire-bote, fencing stock-yards, or other conveniences, for the enjoyment of the said Land, and that no part thereof be sold: Provided, also, that this License shall be determinable, on the Colonial Treasurer for the time being, or any person appointed by the Governor in that behalf, causing Notice, in writing, for that purpose, to be given or left, for the holder of this License, at his usual or last place of abode, one calendar month before the time limited for cancelling the same, and on payment to him of the balance due for the period the License would otherwise have had to run.

This License to be in force for one year from the date hereof.
