CHILI.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the re-publication, from the *London Gazette*, of the 3rd September, 1841, of the following Order in Council, relating to Chili.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the sixth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, but repealed and re-enacted by third and fourth William Fourth, cap. fifty-nine, intituled "*An Act to regulate the Trade of the British possessions abroad*," after reciting that, "by the law of navigation foreign ships are permitted to import into any of the British possessions abroad, from the countries to which they belong, goods, the produce of those countries, and

to export goods from such possessions, to be carried to any foreign country whatever, and that such permission should be subject to certain conditions," it is enacted, "that the privileges thereby granted to foreign ships shall be limited to the ships of those countries which, having Colonial possessions, shall grant the like privileges of trading with those possessions to British ships, or which, not having Colonial possessions, shall place the commerce and navigation of this country, and of its possessions abroad, upon the footing of the most favoured nation, unless His Majesty, by His Order in Council, shall in any case deem it expedient to grant the whole or any of such privileges to the ships of any foreign country, although the conditions aforesaid shall not, in all respects, be fulfilled by such foreign country."

And whereas Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth deem it expedient to grant, pending negotiations for a treaty of commerce between Chili and Great Britain, the privileges aforesaid to the ships of Chili, recognized as such by the British navigation laws; Her Majesty doth, therefore, by the advice aforesaid, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority in Her vested by the said last recited Act of Parliament, declare and grant, that it shall and may be lawful for Chilian ships (recognized as aforesaid) to import into any of the British possessions abroad, from the dominions of Chili, goods, the produce of those dominions, and to export goods from such possessions, to be carried to any foreign country whatever; provided, that, if British subjects and commerce in Chili shall, at any time cease to enjoy all the privileges, whatever they may be, which the subjects and commerce of any other foreign nation may enjoy in Chili, then such permission to trade with the British Colonies shall immediately be withdrawn:

Provided always, that the privileges granted shall be confined to Chilian vessels, built, owned, and navigated in manner required by the British laws of navigation.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

COQUET LIGHT AND BUOYS FOR THAT ROADSTEAD, NORTHUMBERLAND.

NOTICE is hereby given, that in fulfilment of the intention expressed in an advertisement from this House, dated 10th ultimo, a bright fixed light of great power will be exhibited for the first time on the evening of Friday, the 1st October next, and which will be visible seaward from N. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. to S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. by compass; a light of inferior power will also be shewn landward in all other directions. The buoys for the anchorage within the Island, referred to in the same advertisement, have now been placed in the undermentioned situations, and with the following marks and bearings, viz:—

A Red Beacon Buoy, marked "N.E. Coquet," in $5\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms water.

The southend of Morwick trees, in line with the house on Amble Point, bearing W. by N.

A slated roofed House, at Bondicar, in line with Hauxley Point, S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

Coquet Light House, S.S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

A Red and White Buoy, painted in circles, marked "N.W. Coquet," in two fathoms.

The southernmost of two clumps of trees on the south land, its apparent width on Bondicar Point, bearing S.W. by S.

The west end of a long wood, in line with the east end of the sand hills, next west of Alemouth, N. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

North East Coquet Buoy, E.N.E.

Coquet Light House, S. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

A Red Buoy, marked "S.W. Coquet," in three fathoms.

The east end of Shillbottle trees, in line with the Tower of Warkworth Castle, bearing N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

A cluster of trees inland, apparently midway, between two houses, at Bondicar, one having a red tiled, and the other a slated roof, S.W.

Hauxley Point Buoy, S. $\frac{1}{2}$ F.

A Black Buoy marked "Sand Spit," in nine feet, upon the extremity of a reef running from the main land towards the island.

The west end of Warkworth Castle, in line with Amble Point, N.W.

Bondicar Point, in line with the southernmost of two clumps of trees to the southward, S.W. by S.

Hauxley Point Buoy, S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

A Black Beacon Buoy, marked "Hauxley Point," in $5\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, on the extremity of this dangerous reef.

A farm house, having a lofty chimney on its

west end, in line with the house on Amble Point, N. N. W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W.

Earsdon Windmill, in line with a slated roofed house at Bondicar, W. b. S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

Coquet Light House, N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

A Black and White Chequered Buoy, marked "Pan Bush," in two fathoms, on the S. E. part of the shoal so called.

The south part of Morwick trees in line with the north end of Gloster Hill, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

A red tiled house within the sand Hills its apparent width open north of Radcliffe Colliery chimney, bearing S. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

Coquet Light House, S. S. E.

North East Coquet Buoy, S. E. b. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

Mariners are to observe, that the safest approach to this anchorage is north of the island between the N. E. Coquet and Panbush Buoys, there being but eight feet water in the south entrance—viz., between the S. W. Coquet and the Sand Spit Buoys.

N. B.—The above bearings are magnetic; and the depths of water, those of low water spring tides.

KINGSTOWN HARBOUR LIGHTS.

Ballast Office, Dublin,

August, 1841.

THE Corporation for preserving and improving the Port of Dublin, hereby give Notice, that on the evening of the 1st of October next, the appearance of the Light hitherto shewn from the East Pier Head of Kingstown Harbour, will be altered from the present revolving White Light, to a revolving Light shewing White and Red Lights alternately, and seen at shorter intervals of time. A small fixed Red Light will also be exhibited from the West Pier Head. The Lights so to be shewn, will, thenceforth, be continued from sun-set to sun-rise.

Specification given of the appearance of the Tower, &c., by Mr. Halpen, the Inspector of Light-Houses.

The Light at present shewn on the Kingstown East Pier Head, is a revolving White Light, shewing once in a minute. That to be exhibited on the 1st of October next, will also be a revolving Light, presenting White and Red Lights alternately, attaining their greatest brilliancy at equal intervals of 30 seconds.

The Light will be shewn from the present timber building, (which is coloured,) and will be open to the harbour and to seaward, as heretofore. It is

elevated 34 feet above the level of high-water springs, and 40 feet above the mean level of the sea.

A small fixed Red Light will, at the same time, be shewn from the Kingstown West Pier Head.

The Kingstown East Pier Light House bears from the Kish Bank Floating Light W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., distant $6\frac{3}{4}$ nautic miles; from the Poolbeg Light, south, distant $2\frac{3}{4}$ nautic miles.

The bearings given are magnetic—var. 26° $30'$ W.

QUIT RENTS.

THE Colonial Treasurer having reported that he is now prepared to enter upon the collection of Quit Rents, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs the re-publication of the Notice on this subject, dated 4th September, 1841.

His Excellency further directs it to be notified, that the Collectors of Quit Rents are to pay into the Colonial Treasury, on the 15th day of each month, the amount of their respective collections for the preceding month, accompanied by a statement of particulars.

The Collectors will also furnish to each person from whom they may receive Quit Rents, a memorandum of the amount, and of the Grant for which it may be paid; and it is requested that this document may be forwarded, without delay, to the

Colonial Treasurer, who will thereupon issue a receipt for the Quit Rent paid, in his own name.

QUIT RENTS.

THE collection proposed by the Government Notice of 1st January, 1841, to have been made in the present year, of a portion of the sum due for Quit Rents having been postponed, in consequence of the temporary absence of the Colonial Treasurer, until 1842; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that all persons indebted to the Government, on account of Quit Rents, will be required to pay the same, in whole or in part, during the next year, according to the following arrangement, viz:—

1. Collectors will be appointed in each District, and will be instructed to demand, on the 1st April next, the amount payable for the year 1841, together with an equal amount (where due) for arrears of former years.

2. If these amounts be paid within three months from the day on which they are demanded, no further payment will be required until the year 1843, when a similar demand will be made of the Quit Rent for 1842, with an equal amount for the arrears due on 31st December, 1840.

In future years a demand will in like manner be made, of double the amount due for the year immediately preceding, until all arrears be liquidated, when the amount stated in the Deed of Grant will alone be demanded yearly.

3. If not paid within three months from the date of the first demand, the Collectors will be authorized to proceed by distress or arrest; and in every such case the whole amount due will be levied at once.

4. For such sums as the Collectors may obtain, they will be allowed five per cent. if the money be paid voluntarily, and ten per cent. if recovered by distress or arrest.

5. Such persons as, before the 1st of April next, may pay into the Treasury, at Sydney, the amount proposed to be levied in the ensuing year, will be allowed a deduction of five per cent., being the per centage that would otherwise be paid to the Collectors.

6. During the present and succeeding year, namely, until the 31st December, 1842, but not afterwards, all persons whatever will be permitted to redeem their Quit Rents, whether for Town Allotments or Portions of Land, and whether the Deed of Grant contain any covenant for redemption, or not, on payment of ten years' rent and all arrears due, into the Treasury.

In such cases, the Discount of five per cent. will be allowed on the arrears, if paid before the 1st of April next, but not on the sum paid for the redemption of the Rents.

CONDITIONS.

QUALITIES OF THE SUPPLIES.

1. All the articles shall be of the best quality of their several kinds.

2. The Bread shall be the produce of clean, sound Colonial Wheat, Barley and Maize, from which, on the Military Ration 20 per cent., and on the Convict Ration 10 per cent., has been extracted in bran and waste. The Wheaten Bread shall be made in loaves of 3lbs, and the Mixed Bread in loaves of $3\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. each, and baked 24 hours before being issued.

3. The Fresh Meat for the Military Ration shall be in the proportion of 5lbs. of Beef and 2lbs. of Mutton, Weekly, deliverable alternately in fore and hind quarters, when the quantity admits of it; for the Convict Rations, the Beef shall be delivered in the same manner; Salted Beef being issued only in summer to Road Parties, and when authorised.

4. The Maize Meal shall be similar in quality to the Wheaten Meal, and shall be twice ground.

5. The Vegetables for the Hospitals and other Establishments entitled thereto, shall be supplied in reasonable proportions of Potatoes, Greens, Pumpkins, Onions, &c.

The Rum shall be West India, five per cent. under proof.

MODE OF DELIVERY.

6. No part whatever of the Supplies above specified shall be received in charge of the Commissariat, but shall all be delivered by the Contractor direct to the Parties or Establishments entitled thereto, upon the written order of the Commissariat Officer in charge of the District, or of the person authorised for that purpose.

7. At the several fixed Stations the Rations for the Troops, the Convict Establishments, and Road and other parties, shall be delivered by the Contractor at the Barracks, Establishments, or Huts, where the Parties to be supplied are stationed; being previously to removal from the Contractor's Premises approved by a Person authorised for the purpose.

8. The Forage shall be delivered by the Contractor at the Establishments where the Horses or Cattle are stationed; and in case the whole Ration of Forage be not required or delivered, each of the species shall be reckoned as the proportion of the Ration undermentioned, viz. :—

- The Maize or Barley 4-12lbs.
- The Hay 5-12lbs.
- The Bran. 2-12lbs.
- The Straw 1-12lb.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

9. Parties tendering may do so by either of the three following modes, at their option, viz. :—

1. The whole of the Supplies of every description, in each District, may be included in one Tender, as at present.

2. Or the Supplies may be tendered in sub-divisions, as below, by a separate Tender for each sub-division, viz. :—

1. The Military Ration.
2. The several Rations for Convicts are described from 2 to 8, inclusive.
3. The Ration of Forage.
4. The Ration of Fuel and Light.
5. The supplies for Hospitals.
6. The Supplies for the Penal Settlements, (Sydney).

3. Or the various articles comprising the several Rations referred to, as well as all those required for Hospitals and other purposes, may be tendered separately or singly, by weight and measure. The undersigned reserving to himself the power of accepting Tenders for supplying by any of these modes, which he may find most expedient.

10. Contractors supplying Road Parties on the Bathurst or other roads similarly situated, shall have at all times on the spot a supply for fourteen days in reserve, in the care of a competent Agent, to whom reference may be had in the Contractor's absence.

11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the party receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a Board of Survey, according to the practice of the Service. But in Country Districts, where a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the Party objecting will name one person as Arbitrator, the Contractor or his Agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part,) concur in naming a third as umpire, who in event of the Arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

If the Board, Arbitrators, or Umpire, shall decide that the article is not according to the Conditions of the Contract, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing of which it will be procured, and the expense charged to his account.

12. It shall be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the Contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three *calendar months* to the opposite Party, and to end the Contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the Contract is made, or agreed to be made; and not later than the 1st of August.

13.
