PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight Captain General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, issued in pursuance of an Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, passed in the second year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "*An Act further to restrain the unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands, and to provide the means of defraying the expense of a Border Police*," the Crown Lands of the said Territory, adjacent to, and beyond the limits at present allotted for location, were divided into Nine Districts, one of which, numbered One, and designated the Port Macquarie District, was described as bounded on the west by a line north by compass from the top of Werrekembee Mountain; on the south by the range extending from Werrekembee to Crescent Head, a point on the coast;

on the east by the sea coast; and on the north the boundary to be indefinite; and whereas it is found expedient to divide the same;—Now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in virtue of the authority in me vested by the above recited Act, do hereby proclaim that the said District has been divided into two Districts, and the following are the boundaries of the same respectively, namely:—

M'LEAY RIVER DISTRICT;—bounded on the west by a line north by compass from the top of Werrekembee Mountain, at the head of the Hastings River; on the south by the range extending from Werrekembee to the Crescent Head, a point on the sea coast; on the east by the sea coast; and on the north by the ranges which form the basin of the Clarence on the south side of that river.

CLARENCE RIVER DISTRICT;—bounded on the south by the ranges which form the basin of the Clarence on the south side of that river; on the west by the New England District, the boundary being a line north by compass from Werrekembee Mountain, which is at the head of the Hastings River; on the north by the ranges forming the basin of the Brisbane and the Logan, on the south side of those rivers; and on the east by the sea coast.

SUPREME COURT, PORT PHILLIP.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that in pursuance of the provisions of the Act of the Colonial Legislature, 4th Victoria, No.

22, intituled "*An Act for the more effectual Administration of Justice in New South Wales and its Dependencies,*" the following Rules and Orders of the Supreme Court, at Port Phillip, have been transmitted to His Excellency by His Honor Mr. Justice Willis, and will be forwarded, as soon as conveniently may be, to the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, for Her Majesty's approval or disallowance thereof.

IN pursuance of the power given to him by the 2nd and 103rd sections of the Act 5th Victoria, No. 17, intituled "*An Act for giving relief to Insolvent persons, and providing for the due collection, administration, and distribution of Insolvent Estates, within the Colony of New South Wales, and for the prevention of Frauds affecting the same,*" the following Rules and Orders are made by His Honor the Resident Judge, for carrying the said Act into effect:—

RULES AND ORDERS.

I. The Resident Judge will, on receiving one day's previous notice, sit, at such times as he may be required, at 11 o'clock A.M., or at such other hour as the general business of the Court will permit, for the hearing and determination of all matters committed to the Court by the Insolvent Act; and all such matters may also be brought before the Court on any Banco day, or at the sitting or rising of the Court in any day in Term.

II. All applications under the Act, to the Judge of the Court, shall be made to the Judge at Chambers, in the same manner as other Chamber business of the Court, except that where in other cases a Summons for parties to attend is required to be issued or signed by the Chief Clerk, it shall, in Insolvent Estate proceedings, be issued and signed by the Chief Commissioner of Insolvent Estates.

III. The Chief Commissioner for the District of Port Phillip, shall have the same notice of intended applications to the Court or Judge, in matters relating to his office or duties, as is required to be given by any practice or rule of Court, to parties interested in, or intended to be, affected by any application; and where, upon any such application, a reference may be required to be made to any of the proceedings in any Insolvent Estate, he shall also have notice thereof.

IV. The Chief Commissioner shall attend the Court upon all sittings for the despatch of business relating to Insolvent Estates, and minute and record all proceedings, orders, and judgments of the Court thereon; and, when required, shall have ready for reference the proceedings under his charge in any Estate.

V. The Chief Commissioner shall personally, or in case of his unavoidable absence, by some proper person authorised by him, make all applications and reports to the Court or Judge required by the Act to be made by the said Commissioner, or by the Trustees of any Insolvent Estate; provided that where any such applications shall require argument by Counsel, then the Commissioner may direct the Trustees to undertake the same. But in no case shall costs of Attorney or Counsel be charged against the Estate, unless specially allowed by the Judge.

VI. All Process of this Court, necessary to be issued for procuring the attendance of any person before the Court, or Judge, or Commissioner, in matters relating to Insolvent Estates, shall be issued and signed by the Chief Commissioner.

VII. All Petitions, Schedules, Reports, and Proceedings in Insolvent Estates, shall be written or printed bookwise, on paper of the ordinary foolscap size, with two inches vacant space on the left hand side, and not less than one inch at the top and bottom, and the Chief Commissioner shall keep and preserve the proceedings in every Estate, when completed, separately numbered and indexed for reference and covered.

VIII. Any person summoned to shew cause why his Estate should not be adjudged to be Sequestrated, shall, within four days after being so summoned, deliver to the Chief Commissioner, when the residence of such person is within twenty-five miles of such Commissioner's residence, and when it is at a greater distance, then shall, within the said time, put into the nearest Post Office, addressed to such Commissioner, a statement in writing, signed by him, the Insolvent, of any facts alleged in the summons which he intends to dispute, and the said Commissioner shall file the same with the proceedings in the case; and such statement shall stand as, or in lieu of, a plea in denial of the facts disputed.

IX. All facts, no notice of an intention to dispute which, shall have been so given, shall upon the hearing of the case, be taken to be admitted by the person so summoned, and the petitioning Creditor shall not be required to prove the same.

X. The proceedings upon the hearing of any such case shall be, as near as may be, the same as upon any ordinary trial.

XI. The Chief and other Commissioners of Insolvent Estates, messengers, and officers employed by them, shall be entitled to receive the fees in the Schedule hereunto annexed, for the several matters specified; and each Commissioner shall, four times in every year, viz., 1st of January, 1st of April, 1st of July, and 1st of October, report to the Court the amount of fees payable to them, and to the several messengers and officers employed under them during the previous quarter.

XII. The Chief Commissioner shall also report to the Court, yearly, on the 1st of January, or so soon after, as a Court shall be holden for the purposes of this Act, the amount of Government fees and auction, and other duties, Post Office charges, and advertisements in the *Government Gazette*, which shall have been paid during the preceding year, respecting Insolvent Estates, so far as the same can be ascertained.

XIII. A Schedule of all fees receivable under the Act, shall be hung up in a conspicuous place in the Office of the Chief and every other Commissioner of Insolvent Estates.
