**HIS** Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that Licenses for cutting Timber at Moreton Bay will be granted, on application either to the Colonial Treasurer, in Sydney, or to Stephen Simpson, Esq., Commissioner of Crown Lands, at Brisbane.

The conditions of the License will be these set

forth in the Government Notice of 21st May, 1839, published in the *Gazette* of 22nd May, 1839; but no person will be allowed to cut Timber within five miles of the town of Brisbane, measured by land, or seven miles measured by water.

His Excellency further directs it to be notified, that Stephen Simpson, Esq., has been authorised to issue Annual Licenses for the making of Bricks on Crown Lands, at such places as may be approved by the Commissioner; the fee on each License will be £5, but the License will entitle the holder of it to employ any number of men, provided they be employed for his own use, or on his own account.

Licenses will also be issued in a similar way, authorising persons to Quarry Stone on Government Lands, at such places as may be approved by the Commissioner, the fee on each Annual License of this nature will be £2 only.

Licenses for the erection of temporary Buildings on Crown Lands, will also be granted in cases of urgency, but the fee on each License of this nature will be £10, payable annually.
