By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, with the advice of the Legislative Council.

An Act to permit Goods, the Produce or Manufacture of New Zealand or Yan Diemen's Land, to be Imported into the Colony of New South Wales, free of Duty; and to indemnify certain Officers for acts already done.

HEREAS New Zealand has been recently formed into a separate and independent Colony; and whereas the free importation into New South Wales of goods and manufactures, the produce of New Zealand or Van Diemen's Land, may be productive of considerable commercial advantages to the trade, as well of New South Wales as of both those Colonies:

Produce of Be it therefore enacted, by His Exvan Diecellency the Governor of New South men's Land, Wales, with the advice of the Legisand New lative Council thereof, That from and after the passing of this Act, all goods and commodities, (except spirituous liquors, cordials, or liqueurs) being the growth, produce, or manufacture of Van Diemen's Land, or of New Zealand, may be imported into the Colony of New South Wales, free of any duty.

(Not to extend to articles of foreign growth or

II. Provided always, and be it enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to allow of the importation, free of duty, of any goods or commodities whatever, not being the growth, production, or manufacture of Van Diemen's Land or New Zealand respectively; but that all articles of foreign growth, production, or manufacture, imported from any place or port in Van Diemen's Land, or New Zealand, into New South Wales, shall be liable and subject to the payment of such duties as may be imposed and chargeable according to the laws and reg-

ulations in force in New South Wales, at the time of the importation of such articles of foreign growth or manufacture. (To remove doubts which may have existed in re-

spect to the admission, free of duty, of the pro-duce of Van Diemen's Land, since the passing of the Act 4 Victoria, No. 11, and to indemnify Officers of the Customs for acts already done. III. And whereas since the passing, in the Fourth Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, of the Act, intituled "An Act for in-"creasing the duties on Spirits, Wine, and other goods, and merchandise, imported into the Colony " of New South Wales and its Dependencies" doubts may arise as to the exemption from duty of the produce or manufactures of Van Diemen's Land, (excepting spirituous liquors) imported into New South Wales;—for the removal of such doubts, as well as for the indemnification of all Officers of Customs in New South Wales, or any person or persons acting in their aid or assistance, Be it enacted, That all Officers of Customs, and any person or persons acting in their aid or assistance, person of persons acting in their and or assistance, shall be freed and discharged from all damages, penalties, forfeitures, and charges whatsoever, to which they might otherwise be liable, for having permitted the importation of the produce or manufactures of Van Diemen's Land, (excepting spirituous liquors, cordials or liqueurs) into the Colony of New South Wales, without any duty being paid thereon; and that all such importation shall be,
