JOHN SMITH BURKE, Assistant Surveyor, to be a Commissioner of Crown Lands, in the Colony of New South Wales, to act within the boundaries of the Colony, under the provisions of the Acts of the Governor and Council, 4th William IV., No. 10, and 5th William IV., No. 12, and to execute the duties required by the 7th William IV., No. 4, and 2nd Victoria, No. 27, and the regulations founded thereon, contained in the Government order of the 21st May, 1839, and also the provisions of the 5th Victoria, No. 1.

IIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct that the general objects of the undermentioned Bill, about to be brought under consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command, E. DEAS THOMSON.

No. 1.—'A Bill to appropriate, for a limited time,
"from the General Revenue of New South
"Wales, certain Sums in aid of the Melbourne
"Police, and the Town Fund to be raised by

the Corporation of Melbourne."

It is proposed by this Bill, that the fees taken at all Police Offices in Melbourne, except the Water Police Office, shall be applied towards the maintenance of the Police Force to be appointed for the Town of Melbourne, under the Act incorporating the Inhabitants thereof.

That any sum, not exceeding one thousand five hundred pounds in any one year, may be

issued and applied from the General Revenue of the Colony, exclusive of the said fees, towards the maintenance of such Police Force, on condition that an equal amount shall have been levied by rates on the Iohabitants of the said Town; and that any sum not exceeding half the amount authorised to be so applied out of the said General Revenue in any year, may be issued and applied as aforesaid, notwithstanding that an equal amount shall not have been previously levied by rates on the said Inhabitants.

That any sum not exceeding two thousand pounds may be issued and applied in any one year in aid of the "Town Fund" to be levied under the provisions of the Act aforesaid, on condition that an equal sum shall have been previously levied by assessment on the Inhabitants of the said Town.

That the management of the said Police Force shall remain in the hands of the Executive Government.

That the appropriation aforesaid shall be continued for five years, unless in the mean time any Legislature, based wholly or in part on popular representation, be granted to the Colony, in which case it shall cease at the expiration of twelve months from the day on which such Legislature shall have first met for dispatch of business.
