**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct, that the general objects of the following Bills, about to be brought under consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

*By His Excellency's Command,  
 E. DEAS THOMSON.*

No. 1.—“*A Bill to declare that an Act, passed in the present Session of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, to Incorporate the City of Sydney, may at any time be altered, amended, or repealed.*”

It being expedient to remove any doubt as to the power of the Council at any time to alter or repeal the Sydney Corporation Act, 6 Victoria, No. 3:—

It is proposed to declare, that nothing contained in that Act shall at any time be held to prevent the alteration or repeal of the whole or any part of the same.

No. 2.—“*A Bill to amend Schedule C of an Act intituled ‘An Act for appointing and empowering Commissioners to examine and report upon claims to grants of land, under the Great Seal of the Colony of New South Wales.’*”

It being expedient to amend so much of Schedule C of 5 William IV., No. 21, as relates to the fee on final Reports, payable to the Secretary of the Commissioners:—

It is proposed that the fee to be received by the said Secretary for every final Report shall be Four Pounds Three Shillings, instead of Two Pounds.

**ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD,  
 OR,  
 A FREE PARDON AND PASSAGE TO  
 ENGLAND.**

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the night of the 23rd February last, a party of six or more Europeans, surprised a number of Aboriginal Natives sleeping in a Tea-tree scrub, in the immediate vicinity of the station of Messrs. Smith and Osbrey, in the Portland Bay district, and then and there

barbarously murdered three Aboriginal females and one male child, by Gun or Pistol shots, besides wounding a fourth female; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Reward of One Hundred Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons (except the actual perpetrators) who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the parties guilty of the above crime; and if the party giving such information be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Free Pardon and passage to England to such prisoner of the Crown.
