PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General, and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

W HEREAS, by an Act of the GOVERNOR of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the second year of Legislative Council, passed in the second year of His late Majesty's reign, initialed "An Act for repealing so much of an Act, initialed "An Act to continue until further provision shall be made, certain Duties, Tolls, Rales, Fees, or other sums of money imposed by the Governors of New South Wales," and for other purposes as relates to the levying of Tolls in New South Wales, and for raising a fund towards making, repairing, and unholding Public Roads. Bridges. and Ferries. upholding Public Roads, Bridges, and Ferries, and for regulating the collection of Tolls thereon," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, by any Proclamation or Pro-clamations under his hand, from time to time, to appoint places at which Tolls shall be collected, and to cause the same to be collected upon any line of Road which has been or shall be wholly or partly made, and which is repaired at the Public expense, and to cause Toll to be collected at any Bridge, built, purchased, or repaired at the Public expense, and at any Ferry constructed or upheld at the same, and to cause such Gates, Bars, Chains, Rails and Fences, to be built and set up, as shall be deemed necessary for preventing Passengers, Beasts, and Carriages, from passing, unless there shall be then paid such Toll as shall be due or demandable under the authority of the said recited demandable under the authority of the said recited Act; And whereas, by my Proclamations, bearing date respectively, the 20th day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two; the 8th day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six; and the 31st day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty, certain places were appointed for the collection of tain places were appointed for the collection of certain Tolls whereat they have been collected, and it has become necessary to appoint a place on the River Hunter, at the intersection of the new line of road from East Maitland to Paterson Township,

and a place on the Brisbane River between North and South Brisbane, Moreton Bay, for that purpose; Now I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Law or Ordinance, do by this my Proclamation, appoint the crossing on the River Bucker, at the intersection of the new line of Road from East Maitland to Paterson Township, and the crossing on the Brisbane River, between North and South Brisbane, Moreton Bay, to be places in addition to those formerly named, at which Fer-ries shall be established, and at which Tolls shall be collected, to the amount and under the Regulations, restrictions, and provisions of the said recited Ordinance, of which Ferries all persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice, according to the provisions of the said recited Law or Ordinance.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE TO CIVIL OFFICERS.

IS Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct the publication, for general information, and with reference to the Regulations contained in the Government notice of the 7th of March, 1832, of the following Circular Despatch from the Secretary of State, dated 7th March, 1842, respecting applications for the extension of the leave of absence granted to Civil Officers, and the issue of their half-pay for the period of their absence.

(CIRCULAR.)

Downing-street, 7th March, 1842. Str.,-My attention has been called by a variety of recent instances, to the inconvenience arising to the Public Service from the lengthened leaves of absence granted to Civil Officers in the different Colonies, and, in some instances, to those who have applied for, and received, an extended leave of sence without any intention of again resuming their duties.

In order in some degree to remedy this inconvenience, I have to request that you will, in future, abstain from accompanying your leave of absence to any Officer with a recommendation for extension of leave by the Secretary of State. Such recommendations make it very difficult to disappoint the expectations which they have raised; while the Public Service may sometimes be injuriously affected by a compliance with them.

I have further deemed it necessary to lay down a general rule, that, for the future, the half salary for the last half of the term of leave originally granted to the Colonial Officer, shall only be receivable on the return of such Officer to his duty.

Separate Tenders will be required for the Forego in the District of Sydney, and for the Institution for destitute Roman Catholic Children; but the other supplies for that District are to be tendered for together.

The supplies for each of the other Districts, with the exception of those for the Orphan Schools and the Lunatic Asylum, are intended to be included in one Contract; and therefore no Tenders can be received unless for supplying the whole that may be required in the entire of a District, and for each District there must be a separate Tender.

Separate Tenders must also be made for each of the Orphan Schools and for the Lunatic Asylum.

CONDITIONS.

All the articles required by this Notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds.

The Flour and Bread must be the produce of clean sound Colonial wheat, from which, on the Ration of Emigrants, Surveying and Mounted Police, or other parties, Superintendent and Crew of the Floating Light, Men at the Light House, Telegraphs, Boatmen, Apprentices, and the Orphan Schools, 20 per cent., and on the Ration to Prisoners of the Crown, 10 per cent. has been extracted in Bran and Waste.

Beef and Mutton to be issued in such proportions, as may be required for the Ration to Emigrants, and, when the quantity admits of it, this, as well as the Convict Ration of Beef, to be delivered

in fore and hind quarters alternately. Beef to be issued to the Orphan Schools on five days, and Mutton on two days of the week

The Maize Meal to be similar in quality to the

Wheat Meal, and to be twice ground.

When it may be necessary to substitute one article for another, the following proportions are to be observed, viz :- 116 wheat flour or 11b. biscuit, equal to 11th of bread; 11th salt beef or 11th mutton, or 10oz. salt pork, equal to 115 of fresh beef. These substitutions are not, however, to be made except on the requisition of the Officers authorised to draw the several Rations.

Hospital Bread is to be supplied to the Children of the Orphan Schools, and to the Institution for destitute Roman Catholic Children, when required by the Surgeon, in lieu of the ordinary Ration.

Vegetables to be supplied in reasonable proportions of potatoes, greens, pumpkins, onions, &c.,

The supplies for road and other parties are to be delivered at the nearest fixed Stations to the places where the party may be employed; on the requisition of the Officer in charge; and in case the whole Ration of Forage be not required or delivered, each of the species to be reckoned as the portion of the Ration undermentioned :-

The maize or barley 4-12, the hay 5-12, the

bran 2-12, the straw 1-12.

The Supplies (not specified in the preceding paragraph) are to be delivered direct to the Parties or Establishments entitled thereto, on the written order of the person duly authorised for the purpose. The Tenders for Provisions and Forage, when

required by Rations, according to the scale under their respective heads, are to express the price per Ration only.

The Tenders for Forage are not required to state. the price of the Ration for Oxen, as when the latter is required, one-half of the allowance fixed for Horses will be drawn; and one-half the price allowed to the Contractor, whose engagement will be to provide for both Horses and Oxen.

In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the party receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey, composed of persons named by the Government, according to the practice of the service. But in country districts, where such a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the party objecting will name one person as arbitrator, the Contractor or his agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third as umpire, who, in the event of the arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

If the board, arbitrators, or umpire, shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing of which, it will be procured by the Department requiring it, and the expense charged to the Con-

In the event of any unnecessary delay, or failure of the Contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured, and charged

in like manner.

In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from some other cause injury, would be sustained, either by the parties to whom the Rations are due, or to the Contractor, by walting for a Board of Survey; the head of the Department, or Officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the rations are to be received, shall have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality; it being distinctly understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and that the Contractor will have a right to appeal to the Governor, although, in the mean time, he must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing of which it will be obtained by the Officer or party requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the emplies or of the contractor.

quantity of the supplies, or of any delay in deliver-ing or replacing them when required, will also subject the Contractor, upon the Report of the Officer in charge of the parties or establishment, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account; as the Governor may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract.

It will be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to the opposite party, and to end the contract at the expira-tion of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made, or agreed to be made.

The Contractor will be required to prepare his own account, monthly or quarterly; in the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with the requisite vouchers, in a complete state, to the

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Officer receiving the supplies, the same will be forwarded by the latter to the Auditor General, in order that a warrant may be prepared, and payment made from the Colonial Treasury.

The value of all packages to be included in the

prices demanded.

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Printed forms of tender may be obtained at this Office, or from the Police Magistrates or Benches of the several Districts; and no Tender will be attended to unless accompanied by an agreement, in writing, signed by at least two solvent parties, staining their willingness to become sureties for the due fulfilment of the contract, and the bonds must be executed within ten days from the day of acceptance of the Tender being notified, failing of which, the Contracts will be again advertised, another Tender accepted, or the supplies otherwise provided for.

The Tenders to contain the names of the Tenderers and their Sureties, and places of residence,

Each Tender is to be enclosed in a separate envelope, and marked "Tender for Provisions,

A Mail Cart or Carriage, drawn only by one horse, must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses, not more than three passengers; and by three or more horses, not more than six passengers, exclusive of the driver, under a pen-alty of £3 for each offence, on all roads except between Melbourne and Yass, and on that road the penalty will be £10.

All vehicles and horses employed in the conveyance of Mails, are to be at all times subject to the inspection and approval, or rejection of the Postmaster-General, or person appointed by him for that purpose. The drivers and postmen are to be free men, and of certified good character.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement are to be deducted by the Postmaster-General from the next quarterly instalment falling due to the Contractor, and to be considered as over and above any penalties provided by any Act of Council.

Each party tendering, or an Agent for him, must attend at this Office on the day appointed for opening the Tenders; and each Tender must bear the signatures of two respectable and solvent persons, willing to enter into a bond with the Contractor for the safety of the Mails, and the due performance of the Contract.
