#### TEN POUNDS REWARD.

HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that John Howard, a prisoner of the Crown, by the ship Forth, in 1835, but now free by servitude, who was convicted of forgery at the late Bathurst Circuit Court, and sentenced to be transported for life, has effected his escape from the Lock-up at Diamond Swamp, near Bathurst, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that a reward of Ten Pounds will be paid to any person or persons who shall apprehend the said John Howard, and todge him in any of Her Majesty's Gaols.

Name, John Howard; ship, Forth, 1835; free by servitude; age, 38 years; height, 5 feet 43 inches; make, stout; complexion, fair; hair, light brown; eyes, blue; remarks, cast in left eye and scar on ball of left thumb.
