P., to William Martin, who, it would appear, sold to Thomas Bolton, who sold to James Price, who sold a small portion to claimant, and devised to her another portion. Another portion, making up the allotment in question, is claimed by Wilson.

Case No. 1162.—George Graham, of Liverpool, blacksmith.

Two roods and seventeen perches, county of Cumberland, parish of St. Luke, Town of Liverpool; bounded on the north by the present fence, dividing it from Ann Hughes' allotment; on the east by Castlereagh-street 1 chain 43 links; on the south by Cooper's allotment 4 chains 10½ links; and on the west by the reserve for the Township 1 chain 49 links.

This allotment is the southern half of one originally located by Mr. Moore, J. P., to William Martin, from whom, it would appear, it passed to Thomas Bolton, and from him to Price. Claimant, it is alleged, bought of Price and Wilson, but how Wilson claims does not appear.

By Memorial preferred to the first Commission, Nos. 416 of Rourke, and 775 of Hatfield, the western half of this allotment was claimed by both.—It is part of a large allotment, originally located under the authority of Governor Macquarie, to one Paul, who sold to Jordan. In 1826 Jordan agreed to sell, and in 1827 Mrs. Jordan conveyed to Thwaite, who, in 1833, conveyed to Thomas Hatfield the whole of the allotment in question. He is deceased, and his widow now claims. Graham alleges, that Thwaite, in conjunction with one Rat-

cliffe, sold the western half; with other land, to Rourke, who sold to him. Deeds of Grant were prepared, giving the western half to Rourke, but they have been cancelled.

Case No. 1164.—Mrs. Sarah Smith, shopkeeper, and James Watsford, innkeeper, both of Parramatta, by their Attorney, Charles Bethell Lyons, Esq.

Fifty-three and one-half perches, county of Cumberland, parish of St. John, Town of Parramatta, allotment No. 10, on the south side of Hunter-street, in section No. 9, and bounded on the west by a line 1 chain 80 links; on the south by a line 1 chain 77 links; on the east by a line to Hunter-street 1 chain 85 links; and on the north by that street 1 chain 80 links.

This allotment was leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane, for 21 years from 30th June, 1823, to William James, who sold to James Bates, who died intestate, and Mr. Manning sold one part to Sarah Smith, and the other part to Watsford, who have nominated Nathaniel Peyton, of Parramatta, to be a common Trustee to receive the Deed of Grant, on the payment of a fine equal to 21 years of the Quit-rent, as provided for by the Lease.
