PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIFFS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "*An Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies;*" I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at 11 o'clock of Wednesday, the 10th day of January next, the following Portions of Land will be offered for Sale at the Colonial Treasury, in Sydney, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions, and under the provisions of the above recited Act. ## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the republication, from the Cape of Good Hope Official *Gazette*, of the following Sailing directions for Simon's Bay.

## PORT INSTRUCTIONS OF SIMON'S BAY.

1. On the arrival of Merchant Vessels in Simon's Bay, a proper Berth will be pointed out to the Masters thereof by the Harbour-master when he boards them, and no Merchant Vessel shall be shifted from such Berth without his sanction, unless in case of emergency, when the cause of so shifting must be made known to him.

2. Should it be the intention of a Master of a Vessel to discharge or receive on board any considerable quantity of Cargo, a convenient Berth will be pointed out, as close to the Jetty or other Landing place, as the safety of the Vessel and other circumstances will admit; the Vessel must be then moored with two Bower Anchors, and especial care taken not to overlay the Anchors of Her Majesty's Ships, or to give them in any way a foul berth, or to give just cause to apprehend any risk or danger of injury to other Vessels of any description or nation.

3. Ships and Vessels touching in Simon's Bay for water and refreshments, may ride at single anchor in the outer Anchorage, (the line of the inner anchorage to be from the Round Tower to the North Battery,)—but in this case it is particularly recommended to veer 70 or 80 fathoms of Cable, and to keep a range of the other Bower Cable on deck, and the Anchor in perfect readiness to let go. The situation of the Vessel having been taken by landmarks and depth of water—should any accident occur by which she may drift from such situation, or lose her Anchors, the same must be notified in writing to the Harbour-master.

4. It is recommended that Vessels be kept as snug as possible, particularly such as may have to remain some time in the Harbour, for the periodical Winds blow occasionally with much violence. The Sheet Anchor should be always kept ready for immediate use.

5. Ships or Vessels having Marryat's Code of Signals, can make their wishes known to their Agents, in blowing weather, through the Port Office; and any assistance required will be promptly attended to, as

far as practicable. Vessels not having the Code, can make the following Signals with their Ensigns:—

- 1. *Ensign in the Fore Rigging*—I have parted a Bower Cable.
- 2. *Do. in the Main Rigging*—I am in want of an Anchor and Cable.
- 3. *Do. in Fore-Top-Mast Rigging*—I am in want of a Cable.
- 4. *Do. in Main-Top-Mast Rigging*—I am in want of an Anchor.
- 5. *Whift*, (where best seen)—Send off a Boat.

And whenever these Signals may be made, information hereof will be sent from the Port Office to the Agents, or to the parties interested.

**PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.**

**A**LL Persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury, are requested to furnish their accounts, through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors, and Officers in the receipt of public monies, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st instant, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands, respectively, up to that date, so that the entire revenue collected by each may be credited in the accounts of the year within which it was received. The Heads of Departments, and other Officers, who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of the present month, to pay into the Colonial Treasury the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 31st instant.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that, if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report, through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.
