# PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIFFS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to "consolidate and amend the laws relating to Courts "of Requests, and to extend the jurisdiction of such "(ourts in the County of (umberland," it was amongst other things enacted, that from and after the first day of January, 1843, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such Counties and Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its Dependencies, and at such places respectively, as the Governor should by Proclamation for that purpose, from time to time appoint : Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me, by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint, that Courts of Requests shall be holden during the present year, at the times and places, and for the districts hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say :-

At the City of Sydney, for the Police District thereof, as described in a certain notice from the Colonial Secretary's Office, bearing date the 15th day of September, 1841, and published in the New South Wales Government Gazette, on Monday, the 8th day of May; Tuesday, the 6th day of June; Monday, the 3rd day of July; Monday, the 7th day of August; Monday, the 4th day of September; Monday, the 2nd day of October; Monday, the 6th day of November; and Monday, the 4th day of December, and following days respectively.

At the Town of Liverpool, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid notice, on Thursday, the 20th of April; Wednesday, the 19th of July; and Wednesday, the 18th of October.

At the Town of Campbelltown, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid notice, on Friday, the 21st day of April; Thursday, the 20th day of July; and Thursday, the 19th day of October, and following days respectively.

At the Town of PARRAMATTA, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid notice, on Monday, the 24th day of April; Monday, the 24th day of July; and Monday, the 23rd day of October, and following days respectively.

At the Town of Windsor, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid notice, on Thursday, the 27th day of April; Wednesday, the 26th day of July; and Wednesday, the 25th day of October, and following days respectively.

At the Town of Penrith, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid notice, on Monday, the 19th day of June; Tuesday, the 19th day of September; and Tuesday, the 19th day of December, and following days respectively.

TITLE DEEDS OF OLD GRANTS.

IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, with reference to the Government Notice of the 1st October, 1838, relative to the preparation of Deeds of Grant for Lands and Town Allotments promised by former Governors, under the Regulations in force previous to the introduction of the system of sale by Auction under Lord Ripon's Instructions, that, as Deeds of Grant for nearly all such Lands and Allotments have now been prepared, and the object had in view in promulgating that Notice has thus been accomplished, the mode of bringing forward Lands and Town Allotments for Deeds therein prescribed has been rescinded, and the Notice of 1st October, 1838, cancelled.

- 2. It is not the object of the present Notice to cancel claims which may have their origin in transactions prior to the introduction of the system of selling Land, under Lord Ripon's Regulations, in 1831; but persons having such claims must themselves bring them forward; and in the event of its being necessary to refer any of them to the Commissioners appointed under the Act of the Colonial Legislature, 5th William IV, No. 21, as amended by the Act 6th Victoria, No. 11, the whole expense of the reference must be borne by the parties interested.
- 3. In bringing forward such claims, full particulars respecting them must be stated to the Colonial Secretary; and it must be clearly understood that the longer they are kept back, the more rigorously will they be enquired into.

# ASSIGNED SERVANTS.

T having been brought under notice, that the Government has, in several instances, been put to the expense of conveying to Sydney, certain Convicts who have been returned by their Assignces into the custody of the Police at distant stations, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that Assignees returning their Convict Servants to the service of Government, will be required to pay into the hands of the Police Magistrate or Bench of Magistrates of the District in which the men are given up, the expense of their conveyance to Sydney; and that failing to defray such expense, the party returning the Servant will be considered ineligible as an Assignee, and have any other prisoners that may be assigned to him, withdrawn from his service.
