**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight,  
Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the  
Territory of New South Wales and its Depend-  
encies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the Governor of  
New South Wales, with the advice of the  
Legislative Council thereof, passed in the present  
year of Her Majesty's Reign, intitled, "*An Act to  
provide for the division of the Colony of New  
South Wales into Electoral Districts, and for  
the Election of Members to serve in the Legis-  
lative Council,*" it was amongst other things  
enacted, that, in the City of Sydney, and in the Town  
of Melbourne, each Ward of the said City or Town  
should be a Polling Place; and that each of the  
Towns which compose the Electoral Districts of the  
Cumberland and Northumberland Boroughs, should  
be a Polling Place; and that in the County of Cum-  
berland the following places should be Polling Places,  
that is to say, the City of Sydney, the Town of  
Parramatta, the Town of Windsor, the Town of  
Campbelltown, the Village of Penrith, and the Town  
of Liverpool; and that in all other Electoral Dis-  
tricts each of the places at which Petty Sessions are  
usually holden should be a Polling Place, pro-  
vided there be at such place a Clerk of the Bench;  
and also, that such other places should be Polling  
Places as should be declared to be such by any  
Proclamation issued by the Governor fourteen days  
at least before the day of any Election: Now,  
I, Sir George Gipps, the Governor aforesaid, do  
hereby proclaim and declare that the following places  
shall be Polling Places for the several and respective  
Electoral Districts specified in connexion therewith,  
and including the Polling Places appointed by the  
said recited Act, that is to say:—

COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND.—City of Sydney, Towns  
of Parramatta, Windsor, Campbelltown, Liverpool,  
and St. Leonard's, and Village of Penrith.

COUNTY OF NORTHUMBERLAND.—Gosford, Newcastle,  
East Maitland, Wollombi, Singleton, and Wat-  
son's, on the Macdonald River.

COUNTY OF CAMDEN.—Berrima, Picton, Camden,  
Wollongong, and Kiama.

COUNTY OF ARGYLE.—Goulburn and Bungonia.

COUNTY OF DURHAM.—Paterson, Dungog, Merton,  
Muswellbrook, East Maitland, and Jerry's Plains.

COUNTY OF BATHURST.—Bathurst, Carcoar, at Ful-  
ton's, at the confluence of the Wangoola Creek  
with the Lachlan, now Lodges, and at Guyong,  
Dr. Richardson's Grant.

UNITED SOUTHERN COUNTIES OF ST. VINCENT AND  
AUCKLAND.—Braidwood, Broulee, Jervis Bay,  
and Ulladulla.

UNITED SOUTH WESTERN COUNTIES OF MURRAY,  
KING, AND GEORGIANA.—Queanbeyan, Yass,  
The Ashfield Tavern at Wheeo, Braidwood, Goul-  
burn, and Bathurst.

UNITED MIDLAND COUNTIES OF COOK AND WEST-  
MORELAND.—Hartley, Wilberforce, Penrith, and  
Bathurst.

UNITED WESTERN COUNTIES OF ROXBURGH, PHIL-  
LIP, AND WELLINGTON.—Montefiores, Mudgee,  
Bathurst, and Hartley.

UNITED NORTHERN COUNTIES OF GLOUCESTER, MAC-  
QUARIE, AND STANLEY.—Raymond Terrace, Dun-  
gog, Stroud, at the residence of Mr. Rowley on  
the Manning River, Port Macquarie, and Brisbane.

UNITED NORTH WESTERN COUNTIES OF HUNTER,  
BRISBANE, AND BIGH.—Scone, Murrumbidgee, Cas-  
silis, Merton, Jerry's Plains, Muswellbrook, Mon-  
tefiores, and at Watson's, on the Macdonald  
River.

PORT PHILLIP.—Melbourne, Geelong, and Portland.

CITY OF SYDNEY.—Each of the Wards of the said  
City.

TOWN OF MELBOURNE.—Each of the Wards of the  
said Town.

TOWN OF PARRAMATTA.—Parramatta.

**CUMBERLAND BOROUGHs.**—Windsor, Richmond, Campbelltown, and Liverpool.

**NORTHUMBERLAND BOROUGHs.**—East Maitland, West Maitland, and Newcastle.

**PROCLAMATION.**

**By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight,** Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by my Proclamation, bearing date the Sixth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and forty-two, I appointed, amongst other places therein named, that Courts of Requests should be holden at the Town of Wollombi, for the Police District of Wollombi and Macdonald River, as described in the Notice from this Office, published in the New South Wales *Government Gazette*, and dated the 15th day of September, 1841, on the first Mondays and following days respectively, in the months of February, May, August, and November: And whereas it has been represented to me, that it would be more convenient for the inhabitants of the Macdonald River that a Court of Requests should be held there, separate from the Court to be held at the Town of Wollombi: Now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by an Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests, and to extend the Jurisdiction of such Courts in the County of Cumberland,*" do hereby direct and appoint, that Courts of Request shall be holden at the Town of Wollombi, on the third Mondays, and following days respectively, in the months of February, May, August, and November, for the district comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, embracing a midland portion of the county of Northumberland; bounded on the north by the Broken Back Range, from the head of Wallis' Creek, and by the range heading Milbrodale to the Werong Range; on the south-west and south by the range dividing the waters of Yengo and the Macdonald River from those of Werong and the Wollombi Brook, to the New North Road, near Mount Simpson; and on the east by the Mount Simpson Range to Warralong Range; thence to the range heading Dora Creek, and by this range to the Broken Back Range at the head of Wallis' Creek as aforesaid; and at the Macdonald River, at the premises hired from Mr. John Watson, and at present used as a Court House, on the first Thursdays and following days respectively in the months of February, May, August and November, for the District comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say,

embracing the western portion of the County of Northumberland, and part of the southern portion of the County of Hunter; commencing on the New North Road, near Mount Simpson, and bounded on the north-east and north by the Range, dividing the waters of Yengo and the Macdonald River from those of the Wollombi, and its tributaries, Werong, Drew, and Parson's Creeks to the Wambo Range, near Mount Poppong, and thence by the Monundilla Range, heading Doyle's and Greig's Creeks to Widdin Creek, three miles below Tindale's Grant; on the west by Widdin Creek to Coricudgy; thence by the head of the Cudgegong River to Ganguddy Creek; and by this Creek, and a line bearing southerly to Umbiella Creek; and by this Creek to its confluence with the Colo or Capertree River; on the south by the Colo River to the confluence of the Wollemi Creek; thence by the crest of the Range dividing the Colo and Macdonald Waters, to the confluence of the Macdonald River with the Hawkesbury, and thence to Wiseman's Ferry; and on the east by the New North Road to Mount Simpson.

SIR,

1. With reference to my Circular Letter of 3rd March, addressed to the Magistrates, <sup>Announcing</sup> relative to the duties devolving upon them under the Electoral Act, I have now the honor, by <sup>appointment,</sup> direction of His Excellency the GOVERNOR, to inform you that, in conformity with the powers <sup>and enclosing</sup> conferred upon him by the 6th clause, His Excellency has been pleased to appoint you to be the Returning Officer of the Electoral District of \_\_\_\_\_, and to

enclose the Commission which has accordingly been prepared in your favor. It will be necessary that you should immediately make and subscribe the declaration mentioned in the 60th clause of the Act of Council, 6 Victoria, No. 16, before a Justice of the Peace, who, by the <sup>Declaration ac-</sup> 62nd clause, is required to transmit the same to the Colonial Secretary by the first convenient <sup>cepting Office.</sup> opportunity.

2. I purpose, in the present communication, to draw your attention to the duties <sup>General pur-</sup> which will devolve on you and the Deputy Returning Officers, under the Act in question, at <sup>port of this</sup> the first Elections which it is intended to hold under its provisions. <sup>Letter.</sup>

3. The first duty to be performed by the Returning Officer is that pointed out in the <sup>General alpha-</sup> 19th clause of the Act, namely, that on the receipt of the revised Electoral Lists, on the 1st <sup>betical Lists,</sup> of June, from the Clerks of the different Benches, he is to cause a general alphabetical List of the Electors of the whole of the Electoral District for which he is appointed, to be fairly transcribed or printed, with as little delay as possible, and such List is thereby constituted the Electoral List or Roll of Electors entitled to vote at Elections in such Electoral District. It may be proper here to call your attention to the cases mentioned in the 27th, 28th, and <sup>As to cases</sup> 29th paragraphs of my Circular Letter above referred to, and to the precautions which are <sup>where the same</sup> thereby suggested to be taken by the Returning Officer, to prevent persons, whose names <sup>name appears</sup> may appear twice on the same Electoral List, from voting more than once. In Sydney and <sup>twice in the</sup> Melbourne the general Electoral Lists are to be made out by the Town Clerks of the same, <sup>same List.</sup> as pointed out in the 15th clause; and by the 16th clause they are required to deliver a copy of the Electoral List of each Ward to the Alderman of the same, who, by the 25th clause, is constituted the Deputy Returning Officer thereof, as more fully explained in the sequel.

4. As soon as it has been determined when the General Election shall take place, a Writ. Writ will be transmitted to you, in conformity with the provisions of the 20th clause.

5. By the 22nd clause the Returning Officer is authorised, if it shall appear to him <sup>Booths may be</sup> necessary for taking the Poll at any Election, to cause Booths to be erected, or Rooms to be <sup>erected for tak-</sup> hired and used as Booths, in one place or in several places, of each Polling place, and the <sup>ing the Poll.</sup> same are to be divided and allotted into such compartments as shall seem most convenient. The Returning Officer is to appoint a Clerk to take the Poll at each compartment; and, if <sup>Polling Clerks</sup> there be a contest, he is to cause to be furnished, for the use of each Booth or Polling place, <sup>to be appointed</sup> a copy of the Electoral List of the Electoral District for which the Poll shall be taken, and to certify, under his hand, such copy to be true.

6. If you should find it necessary to appoint one or more persons to take the Poll at <sup>Appointment</sup> any of the Polling places in your District, it will be necessary that you should inform the <sup>to be notified</sup> Colonial Secretary, and forward the Christian name and surname of the party proposed to be <sup>to Colonial</sup> employed, at full length. It will be desirable, that at any Polling place where there is a <sup>Secretary.</sup> Clerk of the Bench, he should be appointed for that purpose.

7. In the erection of Booths, or in otherwise providing accommodation for taking the <sup>Accounts of</sup> Poll, it is very essential that you should incur no expense which can possibly be avoided. <sup>expenses, how</sup> Accounts for the same, and for the remuneration to be given to Polling Clerks not being <sup>rendered.</sup> rendered. Clerks of Benches, in the form and with such vouchers as may be deemed necessary by the Auditor General, who will furnish you with the proper forms and instructions for preparing them, are to be rendered to this Office, when they will be submitted for the GOVERNOR'S approval and ordered for payment, under the authority granted to him by the 55th clause.

8. By the 23rd clause, each Elector in the City of Sydney, or Town of Melbourne, is <sup>At what poll-</sup> required to vote at the Polling Place for the ward wherein the property shall be situated in <sup>ing places Elec-</sup> respect of which his name shall stand on the Electoral Roll, but the Registered Electors of other <sup>tors may vote.</sup> Electoral Districts may vote at any Polling Place appointed for the Electoral Districts to which they belong, whether such Polling Place be situated within their Electoral Districts, or otherwise. It will be the duty of the Returning Officers and their deputies to see that these Provisions of the Act are strictly attended to.

9. By the 24th clause, the Poll for different Electoral Districts may be taken at the same <sup>Polls for dif-</sup> Polling Place, but in such case separate booths or rooms must be appropriated for each <sup>ferent Electro-</sup> separate <sup>ral districts.</sup> electoral districts.

may be taken at the same place. separate Electoral District. A Deputy must also be appointed for each such room or booth by the Returning Officer of the Electoral District, and the name of the Electoral District must be affixed on the most conspicuous part of the room or booth.

Returning Officers to preside at one polling place, and to appoint deputies to preside at others. Aldermen in Sydney and Melbourne to be Deputies. 10. By the 25th clause the Returning Officer is directed to preside at one Polling Place of the District. He is also authorised to appoint a Deputy to act for him in taking the Poll at each of the other Polling Places of his District. The manner of appointment is by writing under the hand of the Returning Officer, and a notification of such appointment must be posted up at the Court House of the Police District in which the Polling Place is situated, at least seven days before the day of Election. In the Electoral Districts of Sydney and Melbourne, the Aldermen of the different Wards are to be the Deputies, unless prevented by illness or other adequate cause; in which case the Mayor of Sydney or Melbourne is to appoint a Deputy from among the Councillors of the Ward of the Alderman unable to act.

Qualification of Deputies. 11. Although the qualification of the Deputy Returning Officers, except for Sydney and Melbourne, is not defined by the Act, it is very essential that they should be persons in whom the Electors generally may have confidence; Magistrates of the Territory would be peculiarly eligible for the office. It will not be necessary, it is conceived, to grant any remuneration for this duty, although any reasonable expenses which may be incurred in its performance would of course be allowed.

Adjournment of nomination or of poll in case of riot. 12. By the 26th clause, if the proceedings at the Election are interrupted or obstructed by riot, or open violence, whether on the nomination of Candidates or on taking the Poll, the Returning Officer or Deputy is empowered to adjourn the proceedings until the following day, and if necessary until the interruptions or obstructions shall have ceased. In such case, the day on which the nomination shall have actually been concluded is to be deemed the day of Election, and the commencement of the Poll is to be regulated accordingly. If the Poll be adjourned by any Deputy, he is required forthwith to give notice to the Returning Officer who shall not in such case finally declare the state of the Poll, or make Proclamation of the Members chosen, until the Poll so adjourned shall have been finally closed and the Poll Books delivered or transmitted to him.

Returning Officer to endorse the Writ, and to give notice of day of nomination. 13. By the 27th clause, the Returning Officer is required to endorse on the Writ the day on which he received it, and within four days thereafter to give public notice of the day of nomination, which is to be the day mentioned in the Writ.

Qualification of Members. 14. It may not be superfluous here to refer to the 8th clause of the Act of Parliament, 5 & 6 Victoria, cap. 76, which establishes the qualification of a Member of the Legislative Council:—It is therein provided, that no person shall be capable of being elected a Member, who shall not be of the full age of twenty-one years, and a natural born subject of the Queen, or naturalized by law, or who shall not be legally or equitably seized of an estate of freehold, for his own use and benefit, in lands and tenements in New South Wales, of the yearly value of £100, sterling, or of the value of £2000, sterling, above all charges and incumbrances affecting the same.

Declaration of Candidates, if required. 15. By the 9th clause of the same Act, every Candidate, before he shall be capable of being elected, must, if required by any other Candidate, or any Elector, or by the Returning Officer, make the following declaration:—

*“I, A. B., do declare and testify, that I am duly seized, at law or in equity, of an estate of freehold, for my own use and benefit, in lands or tenements in the Colony of New South Wales, of the yearly value of £100, sterling money, (or of the value of £2000 sterling money, as the case may be,) above all charges and incumbrances affecting the same, and that I have not collusively or unlawfully obtained a title to or become possessed of the said lands and tenements, or any part thereof, for the purpose of qualifying or enabling me to be returned a Member of the Legislative Council of the Colony of New South Wales.”*

Penalty for false declaration. 16. By the 10th clause of the same Act, any Candidate knowingly and wilfully making a false declaration respecting his qualification, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and being lawfully convicted, shall suffer the penalty by law incurred in New South Wales, by persons guilty of wilful and corrupt perjury.

Returning Officer may not object to qualification of Candidate. 17. It is not conceived that, under these provisions, the Returning Officer has any discretion to object to the qualification of any person presenting himself as a Candidate at any election; but should he have reasonable cause to doubt that he is qualified, or if requested by any other Candidate, or any Elector, he will require him to make and subscribe the declaration mentioned in the 15th paragraph, before he allows such Candidate to be put in nomination. The penalty for making a false declaration has already been pointed out, and the party may be prosecuted in the usual manner as for perjury. The election may also be set aside by the decision of a Court, to be appointed under the 36th clause of the Electoral Act, on Petition to the GOVERNOR, under the 46th clause of the same.

Mode of proceeding at Election. 18. By the 28th clause of the Electoral Act, the Returning Officer is required to preside on the day of nomination mentioned in the Writ, at a meeting to be holden at noon, at the

the chief polling place of the Electoral District, and is thereupon to declare the purpose for which such Election is held. If no more Candidates be proposed than the number to be returned, the Returning Officer is to declare such Candidate or Candidates duly elected, and to make his return accordingly. But if more Candidates be proposed, the Returning Officer is to call for a shew of hands, separately, in favour of each Candidate, and to declare the person or persons on whom the election has fallen, and is to return the same accordingly, unless a Poll be demanded by any Candidate, or at least six of the Electors on his behalf; and in such case the Poll is to commence at the different Polling places for the district, as nearly as may be, at nine o'clock of the forenoon of the day appointed in the Writ for taking the Poll, and is not to be kept open later than four o'clock in the afternoon of that day. Proceedings if poll be demanded.

19. By the 29th clause, the election is directed to be held before the Returning Officer or his Deputy, and every Elector is entitled to vote for the number of Members to be chosen for the district, by delivering to the Returning Officer, or his Deputy, a Voting Paper, containing the Christian names and surname of the person for whom he votes, signed with the name of the Elector voting, and containing the name of the place for which the property, in respect of which he is qualified to vote, appears to be situated by the Electoral Roll. Manner of voting.

20. By the 30th clause, no enquiry is permitted to be made of any Elector as to his right to vote, except by the Returning Officer, or his Deputy, at the request of any two Electors of the District, at the time of his delivering in his Voting Paper, but not afterwards, and then only the following questions may be asked, viz:— Questions which may be put to Electors if required.

1st. Are you the person whose name is signed as A. B. to the Voting Paper now delivered in by you?

2nd. Are you the person whose name appears as A. B. in the Electoral Roll now in force for this Electoral District, being registered therein for property described to be situated in (here specify the street or place described in the Electoral Roll)?

3rd. Have you already voted at the present Election?

4th. Have you the same qualification for which your name was originally inserted in the Electoral Roll for the District of (specifying in each case the particulars of the qualification as described in the Register)?

And no person is permitted or qualified to vote who shall be required to answer any of the said questions until he has answered the same, and any person wilfully making a false answer is to be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and may be indicted and punished accordingly. The Returning Officer, or his Deputy, is also, if required on behalf of any Candidate, or his Agent, at the time of delivering in the Voting Paper by any Voter, to administer to him the following Oath, or if a Quaker or Moravian, an Affirmation, viz:— Penalty for false answer.

“You do swear (or if a Quaker or Moravian, do affirm) that you are the same person whose name appears as A. D. on the Register now in force for the Electoral District?”—So help you God! Oath of identity to be administered if required.

21. If it shall appear to the Returning Officer, or his Deputy, upon putting the foregoing questions, that the person claiming to vote is not the same person whose name appears on the Register, or that he has previously voted at the same Election, or that he has not the same qualifications for which his name was originally inserted on the Register, or if he shall have refused to take the oath or make the affirmation above referred to, or shall refuse to take the following Oath or Affirmation against Bribery, he is not qualified to vote, viz:— Bribery Oath to be administered if required.

“I, A. B., do swear (or being one of the people called Quakers or Moravians, do solemnly affirm) that I have not received or had by myself, or any person whatsoever in trust for me, or for my use and benefit, directly or indirectly, any sum or sums of money, office, place of emolument, gift, or reward, or any promise or security for any money, office, employment, or gift, in order to give my vote at this Election.—So help me God.”

It may be proper here to observe that, under these provisions of the Act, neither the Returning Officer, nor his Deputy, is authorised to reject the vote of any person whose name appears on the Electoral Roll of the District, who may satisfactorily answer the questions, or take the Oaths, or make the affirmations therein mentioned. Any persons, however, who may be afterwards proved to have falsely answered, sworn, or affirmed, may be prosecuted under the Act, and their votes will be subject to be struck off in the event of any question respecting them being raised in the Court, constituted under the 36th clause of the same.

22. By the 31st clause, each Deputy Returning Officer is required immediately on the close of the Poll, to collect and seal up all the Voting Papers which have been taken at the Polling Place at which he presided, and with the least possible delay, to deliver them, or cause them to be delivered, to the Returning Officer of the Electoral District. Deputies to seal up and transmit the Voting Papers to the Returning Officers.

23. By the 32nd clause, the Returning Officer of each Electoral District is required at the place of nomination, and as soon as practicable after the Election, openly to declare the general state of the Poll at its close, as the same shall have been made up by him from the Voting Papers taken at the several Polling Places; and he is at the same time and place to declare the names of the persons who may have been duly elected; and in the event of the number of Votes being found to be equal, for any two or more Candidates, he is, by his casting vote, Returning Officers to declare the state of the Poll at its close, and the names of the Candidates elected.

He may not vote, to decide which of the Candidates shall be elected. He is, however, prohibited from vote except in voting himself at any Election, for his Electoral District, except in the case of such an equality of case of an equality of votes. The Aldermen for the City of Sydney and Town of Melbourne, (not being the Deputies not disqualified. Returning Officers for the same) and the Deputy Returning Officers for the other Electoral Districts, are not disqualified from voting by reason of their acting in such vicarious capacity. It may not be superfluous here to call your attention to the 30th paragraph of my Circular Letter, already referred to, which points out the course to be pursued by the Returning Officer in respect to the second vote of any person who may have voted twice. By the 54th clause of the Act, any person polling a second time, or offering to poll a second time at the same Election for any Electoral District, or personating any other person for the purpose of polling, is to be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and subject on conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years.

Return of writs to the Governor. 24. By the 33rd clause, the names of the persons elected are to be inserted in or endorsed on the Writ by the Returning Officer, and the Writ returned to the GOVERNOR within the time specified in it for its return, unless the Election shall have been delayed under the powers given by the 26th clause, and in that case it must be returned as soon after the close of the Election as shall be practicable. By the 34th clause, all the Voting Papers are to be sealed up and transmitted, by the Returning Officer, with the Writ, to the GOVERNOR.

Voting Papers to accompany the writ. 25. By the 35th clause, it is provided, that no Voting Paper is to be rejected by the Returning Officer for mere want of form, provided that the name and designation of the party signing it, and the names of the parties contained in it, be intelligibly expressed and in a manner to be commonly understood.

Voting Papers may not be rejected for want of form. 26. By the 56th clause, it is declared, that no Election is to be held void in consequence solely of any delay which may take place in holding the same at the time appointed, or in the return of the Writ, or of any impediment of a merely formal nature, provided that the validity of the Election be declared by the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, within thirty days from the time at which the Election ought to have been held. It is also provided, that the GOVERNOR and Executive Council shall have power at any time within twenty days before or after the time appointed for the Election, to extend the time for holding the same, or for the return of the Writ, and to adopt such other measures as may be necessary to remove any obstacle by which the due course of the Election may be impeded, and to supply any deficiency that may otherwise affect the same. It is not anticipated that any cause of delay is likely to occur in your District, the inconveniences of which may not be immediately guarded against under the powers granted to the Returning Officers and their deputies by the 28th clause of the Act; but should any unfortunately arise, it will be your duty to communicate immediately to the Colonial Secretary, for the information of the GOVERNOR and Executive Council, fully, all the circumstances of the case, and to suggest such remedies as you may deem necessary, in order that no time may be lost in adopting the measures which may appear to be requisite under the powers granted by the clause now under consideration.

Impediment of a formal nature do not make void the election, if validity be declared by the Governor and Executive Council. 27. You will perceive by the 63rd clause, that if any thing should be required to be done on a certain day, and that day happen to be Sunday, the matter is to be postponed until the succeeding day.

Cause of delay to be immediately reported to the Colonial Secretary. 28. Having now gone through the whole of the Provisions of the Act, which bear directly on the duties to be performed by the Returning Officers and their deputies, in the order in which they are likely to occur, it only remains for me to impress upon you the very responsible nature of the Office which will thus devolve upon you, and to express the confidence with which His Excellency the GOVERNOR relies upon your efficient and impartial discharge of its important functions.

When matters to be done fall on Sunday. 29. Having now gone through the whole of the Provisions of the Act, which bear directly on the duties to be performed by the Returning Officers and their deputies, in the order in which they are likely to occur, it only remains for me to impress upon you the very responsible nature of the Office which will thus devolve upon you, and to express the confidence with which His Excellency the GOVERNOR relies upon your efficient and impartial discharge of its important functions.

Concluding remarks. 30. Having now gone through the whole of the Provisions of the Act, which bear directly on the duties to be performed by the Returning Officers and their deputies, in the order in which they are likely to occur, it only remains for me to impress upon you the very responsible nature of the Office which will thus devolve upon you, and to express the confidence with which His Excellency the GOVERNOR relies upon your efficient and impartial discharge of its important functions.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the re-publication, from the *London Gazette*, of the 4th November, 1842, of the following Order in Council.

*By His Excellency's Command,*

At the Court at Windsor, the 2nd day of November, 1842.

## PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S MOST Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," after reciting that, by the Law of Navigation, foreign ships are permitted to import into any of the British possessions abroad, from the countries to which they belong, goods, the produce of those countries, and to export goods from such possessions, to be carried to any foreign country whatever; and that it is expedient that such permission should be subject to certain conditions, it is enacted, that the privileges thereby granted to foreign ships shall be limited to the ships of those countries which, having colonial possessions, shall grant the like privileges of trading with those possessions to British ships; or which, not having colonial possessions, shall place the commerce and navigation of this country, and of its possessions abroad, upon the footing of the most favoured nation, unless His Majesty, by His Order in Council, shall in any case deem it expedient to grant the whole or any of such privileges to the ships of any foreign country,

although the conditions aforesaid shall not, in all respects, be fulfilled by such foreign country; and it is thereby provided, that no foreign country shall be deemed to have fulfilled the before-mentioned conditions, or to be entitled to the privileges aforesaid, unless and until His Majesty shall, by some Order or Orders to be by Him made, by the advice of His Privy Council, have declared that such foreign country hath so fulfilled the said conditions, and is entitled to the said privileges.

And whereas it hath been made to appear to the satisfaction of Her Majesty in Council, that the Government of Portugal hath fulfilled the conditions hereinbefore mentioned:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers in Her Majesty in Council by the said recited Act of Parliament in that behalf vested, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth declare, and it is hereby declared accordingly, that the Government of Portugal hath fulfilled the conditions hereinbefore mentioned; and that Portuguese ships may import into any of the British possessions abroad, from the Portuguese dominions, goods, the produce of the Portuguese dominions, and may export goods from such possessions, to be carried to any foreign country whatever; provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent Portuguese ships from trading with any of the British possessions in Europe, to such extent and in such manner as they lawfully may under the Law of Navigation now in force:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly as to them may respectively appertain.

**CHURCH GRANTS.**
