PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "*An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies*;" I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at 11 o'clock, of Wednesday, the 12th day of July next, the following Portions of Crown Land will be offered for sale by Public Auction, at the Colonial Treasury, in Sydney, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions, and under the provisions of the above recited Act.
