A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that three armed men have been committing depredations on the Roads in the vicinity of Parramatta and Liverpool; and that on the 17th instant, they stopped and robbed Mr. W. Rutledge of a sum of money, his watch, and coat, on the road to the Ferry at Tarban Creek:—His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that a Reward of Twenty Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who shall apprehend and lodge any one of the said offenders in any of Her Majesty's Gaols; and that if apprehended by a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to him of a Conditional Pardon.
