PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Courts of Requests, and extend the jurisdiction of such Courts in the county of Cumberland,*" it was amongst other things enacted, that from and after the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and forty-three, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such counties and districts, or other portions of this Colony and its Dependencies, and at such places respectively, as the Governor should, by Proclamation for that purpose, from time to time appoint:—Now I, Sir George Gipps, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint, that Courts of Requests shall be holden, in future, for the county of Bourke, at the town of Melbourne, on the first Mondays, and following days of each Month, in the present and every succeeding year.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS it has been represented to me, that, for the convenience of the Electors in the Electoral District of the County of Durham, resident

in the Police District of Patrick's Plains, another place for taking the Poll at the ensuing Elections of Members to serve in the Legislative Council, will be necessary, in addition to the several Polling Places mentioned in my Proclamation of the fourth of May last, published in the *New South Wales Government Gazette* of the fifth of that Month;—Now I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the power in me vested by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the present year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the division of the Colony of New South Wales into Electoral Districts, and for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council,*" do hereby proclaim, that the Town of SINGLETON, in the County Northumberland, shall be a Polling Place for the Electoral District of the County of DURHAM.
