PORT PHILLIP.

RULES and Regulations for the maintenance of good order on the Jetty at Corio, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Couneil, 5th William IV., No. 13 :-

Vessels are not to remain longer than six days alongside the Jetty.

The Commanders of Vessels at the Jetty are to keep a watch on board during the night, and are not to allow any disorder on board.

No person allowed to loiter on the Jetty after

sun-set.

No nuisance to be committed, and no rubbish or

filth to be landed on the Jetty. Boats are not to be permanently stationed at the

Jetty, and only to be there for temporary purposes. Goods or timber landed on the Jetty, to be immediately removed.

No cattle, sheep, horses, pigs, or goats, are suffered to remain on the Jetty, except for the purposes of landing or embarking.

No goods are to be landed after sun-set.

Vessels or boats alongside, or made fast to the Jetty, are to make way for the Steamers when re-

Any person committing a violation of any of the above Regulations, is subject to a fine of Twenty Shillings.
