PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "*An Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies;*" I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at 11 o'clock of Wednesday, the 13th day of December next, the following Portions of Land will be offered for Sale at the Colonial Treasury, in Sydney, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions, and under the provisions of the above recited Act. (Deposit 10 per cent.)

COUNTRY LOTS.

1. **ROXBURGH, 30,** Thirty acres, parish of Falnash, near Meadow Flat, commencing at the north-east corner at a white gum tree, and bounded on the north by a line west 20 chains; on the west by a line south 15 chains; on the south by a line east 20 chains; and on the east by a line north 15 chains, to the north-east corner as aforesaid, being situate about half a mile north of Hayes' 300 acres on the Bathurst Road. Upset price 20s. per acre.
