In the Supreme Court of New South Wales, for the District of Port Phillip.—It is ordered, from and after the first day of April next, that in any Court, where the cause of action is local in its nature, the venue shall be stated, in the margin thereof, as follows, viz:

Town of MELBOURNE shall be a sufficient venue if the cause of action shall arise within the township of Melbourne.

County of Bourke shall be a sufficient venue, if the cause of action shall arise out of the township of Melbourne, and within the County of Bourke, And

District of PORT PHILLIP shall be a sufficient venue, if the cause of action shall arise out of any place out of the County of Bourke.—Dated this
