IS Excellency the Governor, in pursuance of a Resolution passed by the Legislative Council, during its late Session, is pleased to direct that, from the present date, the following Regulations shall be observed in the payment of allowances to Witnesses summoned to attend the Supreme Court, Courts of Assize, and Quarter Sessions, throughout the Colony, viz:—

- 1. No allowance whatever shall be made to any witness residing within five miles of the Court to which he may be summoned to attend.
- 2. To a witness residing beyond five iniles, there shall be allowed only the sum of two shillings and

eight pence for each day's attendance at any of | day of January next, when the personal attendance the said Courts, and six pence per mile for every mile beyond five miles he may reside from the Court.

3. In cases where there is a regular Steam Conveyance, or the passage be made by water, the allowance for travelling shall be limited to the actual amount of the passage money.

4. The allowances to Constables, Mounted Police, and Soldiers, summoned as witnesses, are to continue the same as at present established.
