**SIXTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A
CONDITIONAL PARDON.**

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that the six convicts, whose names and descriptions are given below, effected

their escape from the Hospital at Newcastle, on the 21st instant, and having taken possession of the Cutter "Brothers," then at anchor at that port, proceeded to sea, and subsequently landed on the coast near the Seal Rock, about 36 miles to the north of Port Stephens, and that they are supposed to be making their way towards Moreton Bay; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of Ten Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may apprehend and lodge in one of Her Majesty's Gaols, any of the said prisoners; and that if apprehended and secured by a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to him of a Conditional Pardon:—

Robert Whitehead, by the "Lord Lynedoch" 3; age, 27; native place, Bath; trade, plasterer and slater; height, 5 feet 4 inches; complexion, fair, ruddy, and freckled; hair, sandy flaxen; eyes, light blue.—Remarks:—Small perpendicular scar on centre of forehead, WSS. MAY and woman inside lower right arm, half moon, 7 stars W inside lower left arm, 7 dots on back of left hand, blue ring on each finger of same, scar on back of fore and middle finger of same, I am the Lord of all, outside right leg.

REWARDS FOR DISCOVERY OF ILLICIT DISTILLATION.

His Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct it to be notified, that a Reward of Fifty Pounds will be paid to any person who, either directly or indirectly, may give information to any Inspector of Distilleries, or other Officer of Government, leading to the seizure of an unlicensed Still in any part of the Colony; or information leading to the conviction of any person engaged either as a principal or authorised agent in a licensed Distillery, or rectifying establishment, of any offence against the laws which exist for their regulations; or to the discovery of any practices in, or connected with, such establishments by which the Revenue is defrauded.

The Governor further directs it to be notified, that if the person giving the information be a Prisoner of the Crown, His Excellency will take into his most favorable consideration the claim of such person, for the highest indulgence which can, with propriety, be granted to him.

The rewards and indulgences held out by this Notice will, moreover, be in addition to the share in any seizure which the informer may be entitled to by the law of the Colony.

THE following additional Rules of Practice and Proceeding for the conduct of business, in the Courts of Requests, of the Colony, have been settled by the GOVERNOR, with the assistance of the Commissioner of the Courts of Requests of the County of Cumberland, pursuant to the Act of Council, Victoria 6, No. 15.

R. TERRY,

(An account of particulars may be filed in place of plaint.)

Rule 37.—That in any Action brought in any Court of Requests, the Plaintiff may, in place of a plaint, or declaration, file an account of the particulars of his demand, setting forth in a plain, simple, and compendious manner, the true cause for which the Plaintiff brings his Action.

(Mode of proceeding when Defendant unprepared for trial.)

Rule 38.—If any party, whether Plaintiff or Defendant, shall, by the Affidavit of himself, or some other person or persons, shew to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of the Court of Requests, that he has a *bona fide* defence to any plaint or account filed against him, but that he has not sufficient time for preparing his case, or making his defence thereto (as the case may be,) on the day appointed for the hearing, the Commissioner may appoint a day for the hearing of the complaint or demand; and if the sum sued for be cognizable before the New Sittings of the Court, the Registrar shall summon Assessors for that purpose, on the day so appointed by the Court, the usual cost of whose attendance, as well as the other costs in the cause,

shall be defrayed by the Plaintiff or Defendant, as the Commissioner shall in his discretion direct.

(Time and Conditions of applying for a new Trial.)

Rule 39.—That in all cases, if either party desire that a new trial may be had, application shall be made to the Commissioner for that purpose, provided the application be made before the termination of the then sittings, and in open Court, before the opposite party or his Attorney, or in his absence, after reasonable notice of such application has been given to either of them; and provided also, that such application be founded on affidavit, and shew to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, that, for the purpose of substantial justice, a new trial should take place; whereupon the Commissioner may grant a new trial, or re-hearing of the case, and appoint a day and time for the hearing thereof, on such terms as he may deem equitable, in the manner provided by the 38th Rule.

(Lodgings of Copies of Costs by Attornies.)

Rule 40.—Whereas considerable inconvenience has arisen in many cases to suitors desirous of paying into Court the amount of judgment awarded against them, but are prevented from doing so by reason of not knowing the amount of the costs of Attornies employed on either side, all parties or their Attornies obtaining a judgment or a dismissal, shall within three days after the sitting of the Court, lodge in the Registrar's office a copy of the costs claimed, as consequent upon judgment or dismissal, otherwise payment thereof will not be required by the Officer of the Court, nor execution issue for more money than shall appear in the Registrar's Book to have been awarded at the time of trial on such judgment or dismissal.

The above Rules shall take effect from the date of their publication in the *Government Gazette*.
