PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Legislative Council of this Colony now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the sixteenth day of April instant, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same,—Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, Governor of the Colony of New South Wales, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the twenty-eighth day of May next; and I do by virtue of the power and authority vested in me, as Governor of New South Wales, by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled “*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen’s Land*,” hereby announce and proclaim, that a Session of the said Legislative Council shall be holden on the aforesaid twenty-eighth day of May next, at twelve o’clock at noon, in the Council Chamber, situate in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney; and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

A Buoy, painted Red, with a White Head, has been placed about a ship's length to the Northward of a Sunken Rock lying about one mile and a quarter to the Eastward of the Island "Tiri Tiri Matangi."

This Rock lies nearly in a line between the Peaks of Rangitoto and the little Barrier Island, and has about two feet water over it at low water.

A similar Buoy has also been placed over the Rock lying to the N. N. Eastward of the North Head of this Harbour.

This Rock has six feet of water over it at the lowest spring tides, and can easily be avoided by

keeping towards mid-channel between the North Head and Rangitoto, or with a fair wind passing about midway between the Buoy and the North Head.
