PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by my Proclamation bearing date the sixth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and forty three, Tolls are appointed and directed to be demanded, levied, and taken upon the Parish Road leading from Sydney to Cook's River, under the provisions of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council passed in the fourth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to provide for the making and repairing of Parish Roads in the Colony of New South Wales;" And whereas by the said recited Act, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, by an order under his hand, to authorise the Trustees of any Parish Road to grant a lease or leases of the Tolls to be collected or levied thereon for any period of time not exceeding one year, and from time to time to renew such lease or leases, at the highest or best rent or value to be obtained for the same, either by public Auction, or otherwise; and that it shall be lawful for the Trustees for any such Road to cause a Toll Bar, or Toll Bars, to be erected in such part or parts thereof as the Governor shall approve:—

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, Knight, Governor of the said Colony, for the time being, do hereby authorise the Trustees of the said Parish Road leading from Sydney, to Cook's River, to grant a lease or leases of the Tolls to be collected thereon, according with and subject to the terms and provisions of the said Act; and I do hereby further approve of the erection of a Toll Bar at the brow of Grose Farm Hill, at the point of junction of the two Roads leading across Grose Farm to Newtown, and about a quarter of a

mile south of the boundary of the City of Sydney, on the said Road.

Given under my hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney this 13th day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty four.

#### REGULA GENERALIS.

(9 George IV, c. 83, s. 16.)

WHEREAS, by the Statute passed in England, in the Ninth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, to provide for the administration of Justice in New South Wales and its Dependencies; the Judges of the Supreme Court are empowered to make and prescribe such Rules and Orders, touching (amongst other things,) the Fees, Poundage, or Perquisites, to be demanded by any Officer, or Attorney in the said Court, and the same, from time to time, to revoke or alter, as to his Majesty or his Successors should seem meet, and as might be adapted to the circumstances and condition of the Colony: And 4 Vict., No. 23, and Council, passed in the Fourth year of Her Majesty, to provide for the more effectual Administration of Justice, in the same Territory and its Dependencies, the like power of fixing, from time to time, the amount of Fees and Costs, in respect of all matters at any time pending in the Supreme Court of New South Wales, as well to the Officers and Ministers thereof, as to the practitioners therein, (but subject to Her Majesty's approval or disallowance,) is conferred on the Judges of the Supreme Court, with the power of revoking or altering the same, as circumstances shall appear to them to require: And whereas, it hath appeared to the Judges, that the several Tables of Fees, from time to time established, and now authorised to be taken in the Common Law, Ecclesiastical, and General Jurisdiction, of the said Court, the same having been by them revised for that purpose, should be consolidated and amended, in the manner hereinafter provided:—

(Table of Fees established.)

It is hereby ordered, that the several Fees contained in the Tables of Fees hereunto annexed, and numbered from 1 to 4, respectively, shall be, and the same are hereby established, to be demanded and received in this Court, and in the several Circuit Courts, in the Jurisdictions aforesaid, in lieu of the Fees heretofore demanded and received therein respectively; the present Rule to take effect on and from the first day of next Term.

(Fees in Equity.)

It is further ordered, that the Table of Fees hereunto annexed, marked No. 5, be, and the same is hereby established, to take effect on and from the day aforesaid, for and in respect of all Proceedings and Matters in Equity; Provided that, in respect of all matters and things not enumerated in the said Table, which would in England be done or transacted in the High Court of Chancery, or by any Solicitor of that Court, the like Fees shall in this Court be demanded and taken, as may lawfully be demanded and taken in the said Court of Chancery, in respect thereof:—and the same shall be taxed and allowed in all Proceedings in Equity accordingly.

(As to Remission of Fees.)

Provided always, that any Fee in any of the said Tables may be remitted, on the order in writing of a Judge, in any case where it shall be made to appear that the party is unable from poverty to pay the same.
