CLOTHING AND STORES FOR CONVICT ESTABLISHMENTS.

THE following Regulations having been prepared for giving effect to the Instructions of Her Majesty's Government, for checking the application of Clothing and Stores entrusted for distribution to Officers of the Convict Establishments, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct their publication, for the information and guidance of all parties concerned.

REGULATIONS for carrying into Effect the Order of The Secretary of State, dated 28th September, 1843, No. 154, for the better rendering account of the appropriation of Clothing and other Stores issued from the Depot at Sydney, for Convict Services.

All Officers or Superintendents in charge of Convict Establishments, Hospitals and Stockades, are hereby directed to forward to the Heads of their respective Departments, Quarterly Returns in Duplicate, with Vouchers for the Receipt and Disposal of all Articles of Clothing and Stores which shall have been supplied to them by the Ordnance Department, or received from any other source; such accounts to be made up and rendered as prescribed in a printed Form, and in accordance with the Instructions thereon, which will be furnished for their guidance; and the respective Heads of Departments will, after examining and certifying the same, send the Returns and Vouchers to the senior Officer of the Commissariat of Accounts in Sydney, and will further be prepared at all times to furnish to that Officer any additional information or Vouchers he may deem necessary to call for in explanation or support of the accounts.

In order to ascertain the exact quantity and state of the clothing and stores in possession of the Officers or Superintendents in charge, a Survey will be held at each station as soon as possible after the receipt of this Regulation, by a Board, to be appointed for that purpose, and the Report of such Survey will form the charge of each Officer or Superintendent, in the accounts to be from that time rendered; a similar Survey will be held on the 1st of April and 1st October, in every year.

All future Requisitions for Clothing and Stores for the Convict Establishments and Stockades are to be made in Triplicate, on the usual printed Forms, and in accordance with the Regulation dated 4th October, 1836, and (with the exception of Hos-

pitals) forwarded to the Principal Superintendent of Convicts, to be countersigned by him previously to their transmission to His Excellency the Governor for approval; and Requisitions for Hospitals are to be sent to the Deputy-Inspector General of Hospitals, and those for the brig "Governor Phillip," to the senior Commissariat Officer, for the same purpose.

The Order dated 27th September, 1836, which directs that all Requisitions be forwarded to the Commanding Royal Engineer or Ordnance Storekeeper, is cancelled.
