PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIFFS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "*An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies,*" I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at 11 o'clock of Wednesday, the 11th day of September next, the following portions of Crown Land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, at the Colonial Treasury, in Sydney, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions, and under the provisions of the above recited Act. PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General, and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the GOVERNOR and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to declare the Town of Sydney to be a City, and to Incorporate the Inhabitants thereof," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Council of the said City thereby established, to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal such Bye-laws and Regulations as to them shall seem meet, for the several purposes in the said Act specified, provided that no such Bye-laws shall be of any force until the expiration of forty days after the same, or a copy thereof, sealed with a seal of the Corporation of the said City, shall have been sent to the Governor for the time being of the said Colony: Provided further, that in the case of any such Bye-laws, it shall be lawful for the said Governor, at any time within such forty days, to enlarge, as he shall think fit, the period within which any such Bye-laws shall remain inoperative; and no such Bye-law shall come into force until after the expiration of such enlarged period; and whereas the said Council did, on the eighth day of July last, pass a certain Bye-law, intituled, "A Bye-law to prevent the keeping of Boiling-down Establishments within the City of Sydney," a copy of which Bye-law, sealed with the seal of the said Corporation, was duly sent to the Governor, on the fifteenth day of the said month of July; Now, therefore, I, Sir Georgs Gipps, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance

of the authority vested in me by the first recited Act, do, by this my Proclamation, order and direct that the period during which the said Bye-law shall remain inoperative, shall be enlarged until the first day of November next ensuing.
