PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General, and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by my Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, Tolls are appointed and directed to be demanded, levied, and taken upon the road known as the Jamberoo and Kiama Parish Road, under the provisions of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the fourth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the making and repairing of Parish Roads in the Colony of New South Wales;*" and whereas by the said recited Act, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, by an order under his hand, to authorise the Trustees of any Parish Road, to grant a lease or leases of the Tolls to be collected or levied thereon for any period of time not exceeding one year, and from time to time to renew such lease or leases at the highest or best rent or value to be obtained for the same, either by Public Auction, or otherwise; and that it shall be lawful for the Trustees for any such road to cause a Toll Bar or Toll Bars to be erected in such part or parts thereof as the Governor shall approve:—

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, Knight, Governor of the said Colony, for the time being, do hereby authorise the Trustees of the said Jamberoo and Kiama Parish Road to grant a lease or leases of the Tolls to be collected thereon, according with, and subject to the terms and provisions of the said Act; and I do hereby further approve of the erection of a Toll Bar on the said Parish Road, at the dis-

tance of one mile or thereabout, from Kiama, and adjoining the land occupied by the members of the Scotch Church as a Burial Ground.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

CAP. LXXII.

An Act to clear up doubts as to the Regulation and Audit of the Accounts of the Customs in *New South Wales*. [6th August, 1844.]

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled 5 & 6 Vic., *An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, it was enacted that the Revenue therein mentioned of the Colony of *New South Wales* shall be permanently charged with all the costs, charges, and expenses, incident to the collection, management, and receipt thereof; such costs, charges, and expenses, being subject, nevertheless, to be regulated and audited in such manner as shall be directed by any law of the Governor and Legislative Council: And whereas doubts have arisen whether under and in pursuance of the said Act, the costs, charges, and expenses, incident to the collection, management, and receipt of the duties on goods imported and exported at the said Colony, are not subject to be regulated and audited in manner therein mentioned: Be it and it is hereby declared and enacted, by the Queen's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority Charges and expenses incident to the collection of the imports and exports are not, according to the true intent and meaning of the said recited Act, subject, and shall not be subject, to be regulated and audited in such manner as shall be directed by the Treasury. the Legislative Council, but that all such costs, charges, and expenses of such duties of import and export are and shall be subject to be regulated and audited in such manner as shall be directed by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, of the United Kingdom of *Great Britain and Ireland*, or by any three of them, anything in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

FERRY AT MORETON BAY.

A Ferry having been established between Kangaroo Point and North Brisbane, at Moreton Bay, the dues arising from the same will be put up to Auction by the Police Magistrate, at the Police Office, in Brisbane, on Wednesday, the 15th day of January, 1845, at 12 o'clock, for twelve months, commencing the 1st day of February, 1845.
