CHURCH GRANT.

**T**HE description of the following Grant of land, which has been appropriated to the purposes of the United Church of England and Ireland, as hereunder more particularly mentioned, is published for general information, in order that the parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any

At the expiration of one month from this date, if no caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty appear, a Deed of Grant of the same will be executed in favor of the approved trustees, under the provisions of the Acts of the Colonial Legislature, 7th William IV., No. 3, and 8th William IV., No. 5, viz. :—

86. BATHURST, 1, One acre, parish of Bathurst, town of Bathurst; commencing at the north corner, bearing south  $48\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east 3 chains  $41\frac{1}{2}$  links, and south  $41\frac{1}{2}$  degrees west 3 chains  $41\frac{1}{2}$  links from the north corner of the square formed by Howick-street, William-street, Russell-street, and George-street, and bounded northerly by a line bearing south  $41\frac{1}{2}$  degrees west 3 chains 17 links; westerly by a line bearing south  $48\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east 3 chains 17 links; southerly by a line bearing north  $41\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east 3 chains 17 links; and easterly by a line bearing north  $48\frac{1}{2}$  degrees west 3 chains 17 links to the north corner as aforesaid.

BANKS' STRAITS.

Port Office, Hobart Town,  
26th November, 1845.

A LIGHT is now, and will continue burning, from  
sun-set to sun-rise, on Swan Island, (Banks' Straits,)  
101 feet above high-water mark.

The supporting column is 74 feet 6 inches in  
height; the upper part coloured red, the lower part  
white. Its diameter is 24 feet 6 inches at the base,  
and 17 feet 6 inches at the summit.

The Lantern is 10 feet high, having a revolv-  
ing light, which shows a bright flash of 2½ seconds'  
continuance at intervals of a minute. It has been  
seen on either side from a distance of 25 miles.

The following magnetic bearings were taken from  
the light:—

Peak of Cape Barren..... N. 18° 47' E.  
Look-out Rock (Clarke's Island) .. N. 19° 45' W.  
Reef north-westward of Swan Island N. 46° 0' W.  
Black Reef ..... S. 52° 0' E.  
Variation 10 degrees easterly.

It is also expected that the light now preparing  
on Goose Island will be ready for exhibiting on 1st  
February, 1846.

Goose Island is the western of the Chappell  
Islands. The column which stands on the southern  
point of the Island, is in every respect similar to  
that which has been erected on Swan Island.

The light will be a fixed light.

The following magnetic bearings were taken from

Prime Seal Island..... N. 23° W.  
Reef off ditto..... N. 30° W.  
Extreme of Reef off north-west point of  
Badger Island ..... N. 34° E.

Western extreme of Boxing Island.... S. 56° E.  
Reef between Badger & Boxing Islands S. 63° E.  
South extreme of Clark's Island..... S. 51° E.  
Centre of Kangaroo Island..... N. 20° E.  
Variation 10 degrees easterly.

tions, and Buildings, and as respects the said “ Ferries, including also all Punts, Boats, Chains, “ Ropes, and Appurtenances thereunto belonging, “ and to keep the same in the like state of repair during the whole term or period which the said Leases shall respectively endure; and at the end or sooner determination of the said term, shall surrender “ and yield up the Gates, Ferries, Buildings, Vessels, and Appurtenances, in a good plight, state “ and condition, as to the repairs thereof; and if any “ one or more of the said Lessees shall fail so to do, “ the Lessee or Lessees so failing shall pay, along “ with his or their last month's Rents, such a sum “ or sums as shall be requisite to effect the repairs “ required, to be determined by the report of the Colonial Architect, or any other qualified person appointed to inspect the same under the authority of “ the Governor, which sum shall become and be a “ part of the Rent agreed to be paid for the said Toll “ or Ferry respectively; and shall be recoverable in “ like manner, by distress and sale of the defaulter's “ goods and chattels, under a warrant to be issued by “ the said Colonial Treasurer, or the Colonial Treasurer of the Colony for the time being.”

**PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.**

**A**LL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury, are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.
