WHEREAS the Legislative Council of this Colony stands prorogued to Tuesday, the 4th day of March next; and it is expedient further to prorogue the same;—Now therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, Governor of the Colony of New South Wales, do hereby order and proclaim, that the said Legislative Council shall be, and hereby is further prorogued to Tuesday, the fifteenth day of April next.
