## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General, and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the GOVERNOR and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the 7th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act further to amend an Act, intituled, 'An Act for the better preservation of the Ports, Harbours, Havens, Roadsteads, Channels, Navigable Creeks and Rivers, in New South Wales, and the better regulation of Shipping in the same,'" it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, from time to time, to frame Rules and Regulations to be observed by the Masters and Commanders of all Ships and Vessels in the Harbour of Port Jackson, and by all persons duly licensed to act as Pilots in the said Harbour; and the said Rules and Regulations, and all Rules and Regulations relating to the said Harbour which may now be in force, to alter, amend, or repeal, and substitute others in their stead, as to the said Governor and Executive Council may seem necessary or expedient: Provided that all such Rules and Regulations, or such amended, altered, or new Rules and Regulations, and notice of the repeal of any such Rules and Regulations shall be promulgated by Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor for the time being of the said Colony, to be published in the New South Wales *Government Gazette*, at least one month before the same shall take effect, at the expiration of which time the same shall be, and thenceforth continue to be, in full force and effect:—

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, Governor

of the said Colony for the time being, do by this my Proclamation, hereby promulgate the following Rules and Regulations, which, with the advice of the said Executive Council, have been framed and are to be observed by the Masters and Commanders of all Ships or Vessels in the Harbour of Port Jackson, and by all persons duly licensed to act as Pilots in the said Harbour: and I do further notify, that the said Rules and Regulations will take effect, and be and become in full force from the expiration of one month from the day of the date hereof, and be substituted for the Rules and Regulations now in force for the Harbour of Port Jackson, which are repealed accordingly, from and after the twenty-fifth day of April next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this 25th day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED IN THE HARBOUR OF PORT JACKSON, NEW SOUTH WALES.  
(Vessels to slack down cables, &c., when ordered.)

In order to facilitate the removal and placing of ships or vessels in their proper berths at the different wharves, all vessels in Sydney Cove, Darling Harbour, or the stream, are to slack down their stream cables and other fastenings, and also their lower chains, when ordered so to do by the Port Master, or any of his Assistants, under a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds.

*(The masters of steamers navigating the Harbour between sun-set and sun-rise, to go at half speed, hoist lights, and sound a bell or steam whistle.)*

The master or person in charge of any steamer navigating the Harbour of Port Jackson, between the hours of sun-set and sun-rise, shall not proceed at more than half speed whilst within Darling Harbour, Sydney Cove, or any other part of the Harbour lying to the eastward of Goat Island, and to the westward of Pinchgut Island; and so long as any steamer shall be under weigh within the Harbour of Port Jackson, between the aforesaid hours, the master thereof shall keep two lights burning, the one at the mainmast head, and the other at the bow, and shall continue the ringing of a bell, or the sounding of a steam whistle. And any person who shall offend against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds.

*(Combustible matter not to be heated on board any Vessel in Harbour.)*

No combustible matter, such as pitch, tar, resin, or oil, shall be heated on board of any ship or vessel, either in Sydney Cove or Darling Harbour, but all such combustible matters shall be heated either on shore, or in a boat a-stern at a proper distance from such ship or vessel; and any person who shall offend against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds for every such offence.

*(Signal for Pilots.)*

When any vessel at single anchor, requires a pilot to conduct her to sea, on a Union Jack being hoisted at the fore, the nearest pilot who shall not then be actually and necessarily employed on board another vessel, shall repair on board for such purpose, under penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

*(Lists of crew and passengers inwards and outwards, to be delivered to Water Police Officer.)*

The master of every ship or vessel arriving in the Harbour of Port Jackson shall, within twenty-four hours after arrival, deliver to the Principal Executive Officer of Water Police, a true and correct list similar to that described in regulation sixty-six,\* (of the general code of harbour regulations being the list required by the 5th section of the Act of Council 4 Vic., No. 17,) under penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds; and the master of every vessel about to leave Port Jackson, shall deliver to the Principal Executive Officer of Water Police, twenty-four hours before clearing at the Custom House, a true and correct list, similar to that described in regulation sixty-seven, (of the general code, being the list required by the 6th section of the same Act,) under penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds: Provided however, that if the lists required by the enactments referred to in the aforesaid regulations, sixty-six and sixty-seven, be delivered to the Principal Executive Officer of Water Police, as a Magistrate of the City of Sydney, and within the time prescribed by this regulation, such delivery of those lists shall be held to satisfy the requirements of this regulation.

\* "A code has been prepared, combining with these regulations the principal legal enactments, affecting the masters of vessels visiting Port Jackson, &c., and to that code, which will be issued at the expiration of the month's notice requisite to give effect to these regulations, reference is here made."

*(Vessels not to leave the Port without giving previous notice to the Water Police.)*

No vessel shall leave the Port between sun-set and sun-rise, unless written notice thereof shall have been given, before three o'clock in the afternoon next preceding her intended departure, to the Water Police, either at the Office in Sydney, or at the lower Water Police station, in order that the necessary search and examination of such vessel may be made according to law, before she finally leaves the Port; and any master of a vessel failing to comply with this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

*(No ship's boats to board Vessels while visiting flag is flying.)*

If any master or other person in charge of a merchant vessel, shall order or allow any of his boats to board, or if any of his boats shall board or run alongside, for the purpose of communication with any vessel arriving in the Harbour of Port Jackson, while such vessel shall have the visiting flag flying, (being a blue flag at the mainmast head, as see par. 55, of the harbor regulations,) he is liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds.

*(No shore boats to board vessels until visiting flag is hauled down.)*

No boats whatever are to board any vessel arriving in the Harbour of Port Jackson, except the boats belonging to Pilots, or to the Police or Customs, (and those only in cases of necessity,) before such vessel shall have been boarded by the Health Officer, and the said visiting flag shall have been hauled down; and the Health Officer, on finding that no contagious disorder prevails on board such vessel, and that no other sufficient reason exists for placing her in Quarantine, is to cause such visiting flag to be hauled down; and any master of a vessel allowing an infringement of this regulation, is liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds.

*(Vessels arriving between sun-set and sun-rise, not to come higher up than Pinchgut Island.)*

Vessels entering the Heads of Port Jackson after sun-set, or before sun-rise, (steam vessels and packet vessels licensed by the Collector of Customs excepted,) are not to come higher up the Harbour than Pinchgut Island; nor is the Pilot, or any other person whatever to leave any such vessel, (Coasters excepted,) before the Health Officer shall have visited her, under penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds.

*(Vessels arriving in day time, not to come higher up than Pinchgut Island until boarded by Health Officer.)*

Vessels arriving at any time in the Harbour of Port Jackson, are not to come higher up than Pinchgut Island, until they shall have been boarded by the Health Officer and declared to be healthy, under penalty of not more than twenty-pounds; but every vessel arriving from Van Diemen's Land or Port Phillip, is to be exempt from this restriction, on the master producing a certificate under the hand of the Collector or other Officer of Customs there, that there was no vessel subject to Quarantine and no contagious disease there at the time such vessel sailed, and declaring that during the voyage, such vessel had no communication with any vessel having sickness on board.

*(Vessels from Van Diemen's Land or Port Phillip not having Certificate of health.)*

All masters or persons in charge of vessels arriving from any Port in Van Diemen's Land or Port Phillip, who may not have the said certificate of health from the Collector or other Officer of Customs at such Port, or who shall have had any communication with vessels having sickness on board, are to cause a blue flag to be hoisted at the main-mast-head, and keep the same flying until it shall be ordered to be hauled down by the Health Officer, under a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds.

*(Copy of Regulations to be delivered by pilot on board Vessels required to take a pilot.)*

A copy of the Harbour regulations shall be delivered to the master of every ship or vessel required to take a Pilot on her entry into Port Jackson, by the boarding Pilot; and any Pilot failing to deliver such copy before leaving the vessel, shall forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding Twenty Pounds.

*(Copy of Regulations to be delivered by Police Officer on board vessels not required to take a Pilot.)*

To the master of every ship or vessel not required to take a Pilot, or in the absence of the master, to the Principal Officer on board, a copy of the Harbour Regulations shall be delivered by the Principal Executive Officer of Water Police, or his Deputy: Provided however, that it shall not be necessary in any case to issue a second copy of the regulations to the master or officer in charge of the same ship or vessel, unless on the demand of such master or other officer, and in such case only on payment of a fee of two shillings and six-pence, to be accounted for as other fees collected by the Water Police.

*(Master to give on demand receipt for Copy of Regulations.)*

Every master or other officer of a ship or vessel, to whom a copy of the Harbour Regulations shall have been delivered, shall give on demand an acknowledgement thereof, in writing, to the Pilot or other officer delivering the said copy; and any Pilot failing to demand, or any master of a ship or vessel refusing on demand to give such acknowledgement, shall forfeit and pay a fine of not more than Twenty Pounds.

#### CHURCH GRANTS.

THE following descriptions of Grants of Land and Town Allotments, which have, from time to time been appropriated to the purposes of the Presbyterian Church, as hereunder more particularly mentioned, are published for general information, in order that all parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently; being in addition to the Grants advertised on 8th February, 28th June, 14th July, 1st October, and 12th December, 1842, and on 1st March, 4th May, 6th June, 1st August, and 12th September, 1843, and on 22nd January and 14th May, 1844, and on the 7th February, 1845.

At the expiration of one month from this date, if no Caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty appear; Deeds of Grant of the respective portions of land will be executed in favor of the approved Trustees in each case, under the provisions of the

Acts of the Colonial Legislature, 7 William IV., No. 3, and 8 William IV., No. 7, viz:—

39. NEWCASTLE, 1, One acre, county of Northumberland, parish of Newcastle, in the neighbourhood of Newcastle; commencing at where the bridge crosses the right bank of Swamp Creek, on the Newcastle and Maitland Road, and bounded on the south by 1 chain and 20 links of the Newcastle Road bearing easterly; on the east by 4 chains of the west side of a road 1 rod in width bearing north, dividing it from the Roman Catholic Burial Ground; on the north by a west line of 5 chains to the Swamp Creek; and on the west and south-west by the Swamp Creek upwards to where the bridge crosses its right bank on the Newcastle Road.

Authorised by Sir George Gipps, as a site for a Presbyterian Burial Ground.

40. NEWCASTLE, 31 $\frac{1}{2}$ p., Thirty-one and a-half perches, county of Northumberland, parish of Newcastle, town of Newcastle, allotment No. 275; bounded on the south by 112 $\frac{1}{2}$  links of the north side of Hunter-street bearing west 7 degrees north; on the west by a line dividing it from the Court House allotment bearing north 7 degrees east 175 links; on the north by a line dividing it from allotment No. 196, bearing east 7 degrees south 112 $\frac{1}{2}$  links; and on the east by a line dividing it from the Council Chamber allotment, No. 274, bearing south 7 degrees west 175 links to Hunter-street.

MUSWELLBROOK, 2, Two rods, county of Durham, parish of Rowan, town of Muswellbrook, allotment No. 20 of section 3; bounded on the north by 5 chains of the south side of Hill-street bearing east; on the east by 1 chain of the west side of Sowerby-street bearing south; on the south by a line dividing it from allotment No. 19, bearing west 5 chains; and on the west by the east boundary line of allotment No. 1 bearing north 1 chain to Hill-street.
