CHURCH GRANTS.

THE descriptions of the following Grants of Town Allotments, which have been appropriated to the purposes of the United Church of England and Ireland, as hereunder more particularly mentioned, are published for general information, in order that the parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently, being in addition to the Episcopalian Church Grants, advertised on 8th February, 28th June, 14th July, 1st October, and 12th December, 1842, and on the 1st March, 4th May, and 1st August, 1843, and on 22nd January and 14th May, 1844, and on 7th February, 1845.

At the expiration of one month from this date, if no caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty appear, Deeds of Grant for the allotments will be executed in favor of the approved Trustees, under the provisions of the Acts of the Colonial Legislature, 7 William IV., No. 3, and 6 William IV., No. 7, viz:—

SYDNEY STREETS.

WHEREAS by an Act of the GOVERNOR with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the fifth year of the Reign of His late Majesty, King William the Fourth, intituled, "An Act for better regulating the alignment of Streets in the Town of Sydney," it is amongst other things

No. 33. APRIL 25, 1845.—2

enacted, that before the Surveyor General shall set out the footway in any Street or part of a Street, or public place in the said Town, after the passing of the said Act, he shall lay before the Governor and Executive Council, a plan of the same, setting forth the proposed breadth of the carriage and footways, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Governor and Council, by notice in the New South Wales *Government Gazette*, to fix and declare the distance from the curb stone or exterior edge of the said footway in any such Street, part of a Street, or public place, within which it shall not be lawful to erect any building:

And whereas the said Surveyor General has this day laid before the Governor and Executive Council, a plan of the proposed breadth of the carriage and footways in the undermentioned Street, and the Governor and Council have been pleased to approve the same:—Notice is hereby given, that the breadth of each of the footways in the said Street shall be and is hereby declared to be twelve feet; and that it shall not be lawful for any person to erect any building within twelve feet of the curb stone or exterior edge of either of the said footways in the said Street.
