By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Legislative Council of this Colony stands prorogued to Tuesday, the tenth day of June next, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, Governor of the Colony of New South Wales, do hereby order and proclaim, that the said Legislative Council shall be and the same is accordingly further prorogued to Tuesday, the eighth day of July next.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-second day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

Deakin Robert, Kate, 43, Leicestershire, labourer, 5 feet 10½ inches, sallow comp., brown hair, blue eyes, scar right side of chin, breast hairy, large raised mole centre of same, mark of a bile near right elbow, two small moles below the same, scar on thumb, another on third, and two on little fingers of right hand, scar outside left elbow, another below the same; he was transported before in the same name, per ship Surry (4), in 1823, for seven years, from Stockade, Illawarra, since September 22, 1840.

Delap James, Royal Sovereign (1), 31, county Armagh, farm servant, 5 feet 7½ inches, ruddy and pockpitted comp., brown hair, hazel eyes, tip of nose a little scorbatic, slight scar top of forehead, scar palm of right hand near the forefinger, from Stockade, Woolloomooloo, since 13th of June, 1840.

Dogherty Patrick, Mangles (5), 22, Donegal, labourer, 5 feet 6 inches and upwards, ruddy and slightly freckled comp., light brown hair, dark hazel eyes, (out of irons), since the 18th March, 1842.

Dorney Thomas, Eliza (5), 40, Tipperary, ploughs and shears, 5 feet 7½ inches, ruddy freckled comp., dark brown hair, hazel eyes, perpendicular scar on top of head, and large one on left side, from Escort to Bargo, since 9th September, 1841.

Ellis Henry, John Barry (3), 26, Chester, labourer, 5 feet 1½ inch, ruddy comp., light brown hair, grey eyes, nose a little pockpitted, scar on knuckle of left thumb, from Norfolk Island, since August 1842.

Fahy John, Middlesex, 34, county Galway, labourer, 5 feet 4½ inches, sallow comp., brown hair, blue eyes, eyebrows partially meeting, small mole on bell of right ear, small lump top of head, from Grose Farm, since March 6th, 1840.

Galley Joseph, Lady Kennaway (1), 30, county Surry, soldier, &c., 5 feet 5½ inches, dark sallow comp., dark brown hair, brown eyes, D under left arm, J. Galley, AH inside lower right arm, scar back of left hand, scar back of fourth, rather illegible, inside lower left arm, forefinger of left hand contracted, 2 scars back of same, and nail disfigured, large scar on left shin, from Circular Quay gang, since 29th July, 1839.

Garner John, Royal Admiral (2), 31, Ribchester, Lancashire, iron turner, &c., four years, 5 feet 2 inches and upwards, ruddy, freckled, and pockpitted comp., brown hair, dark brown eyes, horizontal scar over each eyebrow, oak leaves and acorn on left arm, blue dots between left thumb and forefinger, from Stockade, Parramatta, in irons, since 4th July, 1842.

Higgins John, John Barry (3), 24, Lancashire, rope-maker's labourer, 5 feet 5½ inches, ruddy freckled comp., brown hair, brown eyes, eyebrows partially meeting, three warts and scar back of right hand, long scar right thumb, two scars back of forefinger, and wart between fore and middle fingers of left hand, from Norfolk Island, since August 6, 1842.

Higgins William alias Silverlock, Kate, 39, Liverpool, labourer, 5 feet 6½ inches, sallow and a little pockpitted comp., black hair, brown eyes, diagonal scar centre of forehead, horizontal scar under right eye, another under centre of lower lip, breast and arms hairy, anchor inside lower right arm, jagged scar ball of left thumb, blue dot back of left hand, large featured; was transported before to this Colony by the ship York, in 1831, for seven years, in the name of William Higgins, from Escort, 50th regiment, proceeding from Kiama to Wollongong, since 10th March, 1840.

Higgins Patrick, Larkins (2), 36, county Clare, brazier, 5 feet 6 inches, ruddy, freckled, and pockpitted comp., brown hair, light hazel eyes, two small scars on centre of forehead, perpendicular scar on left cheek, THPDMHBH on left arm, crucifix on right, scar on left temple, charged with rape, from James Garland, Hoare Town, since 26th December, 1840.

Hoffman John, Bengal Merchant (1), 31, Surry, boat-builder, 5 feet 3½ inches, dark ruddy comp., brown hair, brown eyes, mouth small, nose thick, ship, woman, and spear lower right arm, top of right fourth and little fingers crooked, blue ring right middle finger, man, woman, tree, 1830, heart and two darts, two birds, from Woolloomooloo, Ironed gang, since June 14, 1837.

Hurst Joseph, Henry Tanner, 27, Lincolnshire, waterman and seaman, 5 feet 6½ inches, ruddy and little pockpitted comp., brown hair, hazel grey eyes, two front upper teeth apart, forehead pockmarked, scar right side of upper

tip, middle finger of right hand contracted, scar back of right thumb, scar back of fourth finger of left hand, from Phillip Island, Norfolk Island, since 1st December, 1840.

Hickey James, Hive (2), 39, Kilkenny, butcher, 5 feet 9½ inches, dark, ruddy, and freckled comp., brown mixed with grey hair, hazel eyes, scar over left eyebrow, scar inside left wrist, several scars on left hand, from Norfolk Island, since 14th January, 1844.

Jones Stephen, Exmouth, 35, Yorkshire, stableman and stonecutter, 5 feet 6½ inches, ruddy comp., light brown hair, dark blue eyes, large horizontal scar across forehead, small scar on left cheek, moon, stars, 1808, F 26, on upper part, mermaid on lower part of right arm, woman, HL, sun on upper part, anchor, CB and bust of man on lower part of left, in irons, from Stockade, East Maitland, since 9th March, 1842.

Johnson Samuel, Hive (1), 28, Chelsea, plasterer, 5 feet 1½ inches, ruddy comp., brown hair, grey eyes, nose large, and inclining a little to the right side, small mole under right ear, anchor inside lower right arm, SH inside lower left arm, from Goat Island, since July 17, 1836.

Joffrey George, H.Vé (1), 39, Devonshire, seaman and farm labourer, 5 feet 3½ inches, dark sallow comp., brown to grey hair, hazel eyes, nose inclining a little to the left side, scar betwixt the eyebrows, blue ring left little finger, left fourth and little fingers contracted, PJME cocoa nut tree and HN inside lower left arm, anchor back of ball of left thumb, scar back of left forefinger, from Goat Island, since July 17, 1836.

Jordan William alias John Leary, Lady Kennaway, (2), 40, Westmeath, horse dealer, 5 feet 2½ inches, dark sallow comp., dark brown hair, grey eyes, eyebrows meeting, two large scars lower part of left side of neck, IL back of left hand, from Norfolk Island, since 2nd June, 1841.

Kent Thomas, Prince of Orange, 33, Plymouth, groom, 5 feet 2½ inches, dark florid comp., dark hair, dark eyes, from custody of a constable, Bargo, since October 24, 1838.

Lea James, Woodbridge, 23, Halifax, North America, sailor, 5 feet 3 inches, ruddy and freckled comp., dark brown hair, brown eyes, lost a front tooth in upper jaw small blue spot inside lower right arm, scar middle and third fingers of right hand, from Norfolk Island, since 2nd June, 1841.

Lumley John, Marian Watson, 26, Sydney, seaman, 5 feet 9½ inches, fresh comp., dark brown hair, grey eyes, from Van Diemen's Land, from Phillip Island, Norfolk Island, since 1st December, 1840.
