TWENTY FIVE POUNDS REWARD, OR A
CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on Tuesday, the 7th instant, the Mail on its way between Bathurst and Sydney, was stopped about sixteen miles from Bathurst, by three armed men, who, after robbing the passengers, removed the Sydney and Parramatta Mail Bags; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Twenty-five Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who shall give such information as may lead to the apprehension and conviction of the parties guilty of the above outrage; and if the person giving the said information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.

PUBLIC MONEY.

WITH a view to prevent the recurrence of the inconvenience which has, in some cases

been found to result from Public Monies having been placed in the Banks by persons in the service of Government to their private accounts; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that, for the future, no Public Monies shall, on any pretence whatever, be paid to the private account of Officers at the Banks; but that, if transmitted through the Banks at all, they must be carried to a public account, wholly distinct from any private account.

REWARD OF A CONDITIONAL PARDON.
