MEMO.—In some former Abstracts of the Meteorological Journal, the words "Dew Point" have been inadvertently inserted instead of "Wet Thermometer"; Notice of this mistake is therefore hereby given for the information of persons who may have filed or kept the Abstracts. The wet thermometer does not directly indicate the dew point; but in conjunction with the dry thermometer, and the height of the barometer; it affords the means by which the dew point can be calculated, either according to the Formula of Dr. Apjohn, of Dublin, or by means of tables published by Professor Forbes, of Edinburgh.
