## APPEALS TO THE QUEEN IN COUNCIL.

WITH reference to the Notice in the *Government Gazette*, of the 24th January last, in which was published so much of the Act of the Imperial Parliament, 7th and 8th Victoria, c. 69, as relates to the admission of appeals to Her Majesty in Council, from the judgment of any Court of Justice in any British Colony or Possession, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication for general information of the following Order made by the Judicial Committee of Her Majesty's Privy Council in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act.

By the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for amending an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty, entitled, 'An Act for the better administration of Justice in His Majesty's Privy Council, and to extend its jurisdiction and powers'" it was enacted, "that it should be lawful for the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council to make any general Rule or Regulation to be binding upon all Courts in the Colonies and other Foreign Settlements of the Crown requiring the Judges' notes of the evidence taken before such Court on any cause appealed, and of the reasons given by the Judges of such Court, or by any of them, for or against the judgment pronounced by

"such Court, which notes of evidence and reasons should by such Court be transmitted to the Clerk of the Privy Council within one calendar month next after the leave given by such Court to prosecute any appeal to Her Majesty in Council, and such order of the said Committee should be binding upon all Judges of such Courts in the Colonies or Foreign Settlements of the Crown:" Now therefore the Lords of the said Judicial Committee of the Privy Council are pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that when any appeal shall be prosecuted from any judgment of any Court in the Colonies or Foreign Settlements of the Crown, the reasons given by the Judges of such Court, or by any of such Judges for or against such judgment, shall be by the Judge or Judges of such Court communicated in writing to the Registrar of such Court, or other officer whose duty it is to prepare and certify the transcript record of the proceedings in the cause, and that the same be by him transmitted in original to the Clerk of Her Majesty's Privy Council at the same time when the documents and proceedings proper to be laid before Her Majesty in Council upon the hearing of the appeal are transmitted.

Whereof the Judges of all such Courts in the Colonies, or Foreign Settlements of the Crown, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

#### REWARD OF A TICKET OF LEAVE OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that Benjamin Hall, of Mururundi, and Alexander Paterson, lately in charge of Mr. John Chilcott's Station, at Doughboy Hollow, against both of whom warrants have been issued for their apprehension, on charges of horse stealing, have effected their escape; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that in addition to the pecuniary rewards offered for the apprehension of these persons by the Association recently formed in the Upper Hunter District for the suppression of horse and cattle stealing, a Ticket of Leave will be granted to any prisoner of the Crown, who shall apprehend and lodge in gaol either of the above-named parties, and if the person apprehending either of them be already a Ticket of Leave Holder, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to him of a Conditional Pardon.

*(Giving Answer in Evidence.)*

It is ordered, that wherever the plaintiff shall intend to rely, in support of his case, on the defendant's answer, or any passages or passage therein, and shall examine any witness before the Master, (under the Rule in that behalf, made on the 2nd June last,) he shall tender such answer (or such passages or passage) in evidence, before that Officer, immediately before or immediately after the examination of such witness.—And the Master shall have the like power, to determine questions respecting the admissibility of any such passages or passage, as he has under the said Rule with regard to the evidence of any witness.

The wet thermometer does not directly indicate the dew point; but in conjunction with the dry thermometer, and the height of the barometer, it affords the means by which the dew point can be calculated, either according to the Formula of Dr. Apjohn, of Dublin, or by means of tables published by Professor Fortes, of Edinburgh.
