**Coroners.**

**SOME** misapprehension being entertained as to the limits within which the several Coroners throughout the colony should exercise their jurisdiction, his Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that in future, no Coroner is to act except within the Police District in which he may reside, and for which he is to be understood as holding his appointment.

In Police Districts in which there may be no Coroners, the inquiries into the causes of any sudden deaths which may happen within the same are to be conducted by the Police Magistrate, (if there be one,) or if not, by any Justice of the Peace of the District, under the powers granted by the Act of the Governor and Council, 1 Victoria, No. 3.

**Twenty-five Pounds Reward, or a Conditional Pardon.**

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the 14th instant, two wool drays belonging to Mr. Kirwan, of Coomer, while passing Lake George, were attacked by four men mounted and armed, who turned the drays off the road into the bush, and finally succeeded in making off with one of them, and its burthen, (the other having been left at some distance;) his Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of Twenty-five Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons, who may give such information as may lead to the apprehension of the guilty parties; and if the person giving the said information be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such prisoner of the Crown.
