WHEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the eighth day of July next: Now, I. Sir George Gipps, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the twenty-minth day of July next; and I do hereby further announce and Proclaim, that a session of the said Legislative Council shall be holden for the despatch of business, and that the said Council shall accordingly assemble on the aforesaid twenty-minth day of July next, at twelve o'clock at moon, in the Council Chamber, situate in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney; and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance, at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal, at Government House, Sydney, this seventeenth day of June, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and in the eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.
