SAILING DIRECTIONS FOR GULF ST.

Aftern making Kangaroo Island, steer E. 3 N. through Investigator's Straits, between that island and Althorpe Island. Should the wind be from the eastward, you will find no difficulty in bearing through the Straits, nor anything in the waymore than is pointed out in Filhedre's clurt. If bound up Gulf St. Vincent great care is requisite to avoid Troubridge Shoal, situated on the west-side of the entrance, as the flood tide through Backstairs Passage sets strong (particularly on the full and change of the moon) directly upon the shoal; therefore, coming from the westward, the shore becomes very low, may shape your course for the Light Wessel St. N., N.
