PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "*An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies*;" I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at Eleven o'clock of Wednesday, the 25th day of March next, the following Suburban Lots of Land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, at the Survey Office, in Melbourne, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions, and under the provisions of the above recited Act. TWENTY POUNDS REWARD OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the morning of the 2nd January last, a man named James Lane, who was employed as a shepherd at a station of Messrs. Cheeke and Broadhurst, in the District of Liverpool Plains, discharged a gun, loaded with shot, at his fellow servant, named Samuel Gledhill, and wounded him in the face, from the effects of which wound the said Samuel Gledhill subsequently died, and that the above mentioned James Lane has absconded, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Twenty Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who shall apprehend the said James Lane and lodge him in any of Her Majesty's Gaols, and if the person apprehending him be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.
