WHEREAS the Legislative Council of this Colony stands prorogued to Tuesday, the 31st day of March instant, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, Governor of the Colony of New South Wales, do hereby order and proclaim, that the said Legislative Council shall be and the same is accordingly further prorogued to Tuesday, the fourteenth of April next.

Given under my hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this twelfth day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and in the ninth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intitled, "An Act to amend an Act, intitled, 'An Act to repeal an

"Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, intitled, 'An Act to authorise the erection of Pounds and for regulating the Impounding of Cattle,' and to make further and other provision in lieu thereof," I did, by my Proclamation bearing date the thirtieth day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty, order and direct, that Notice of all Cattle impounded in the Public Pounds in the District of Port Phillip, should be published by the Poundkeepers of such Pounds in one or more of the Newspapers published at the Town of Melbourne, in the County of Bourke, in the said District; and whereas it is expedient to make other provision in respect of the publication of such Notices as aforesaid: Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, Knight, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said recited Act, do hereby order and direct, that from and after the first day of April next, so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the publication of such Notices as aforesaid, shall be, and the same is hereby annulled: And I do further order and direct, that from and after the said first day of April, Notice of all cattle impounded in any Public Pound, in the District of Port Phillip, shall be published by the Poundkeeper of such Pound in the *Port Phillip Government Gazette*, published at the Town of Melbourne, in the County of Bourke, in the District aforesaid.




