One brindle strawberry steer, a blotched brand near rump, twelve months old.

One red bullock, hoop horns, branded IW off rump, resembling TEP on ribs.

One white and red bullock, one horn drooping, same brands.

One bay gelding, black points, saddle marks, switch tail, near hind fetlock white, branded TD near shoulder, CC off shoulder.
