CIRCULAR QUAY-SYDNEY COVE.

THE following Rules for the Regulation of the Circular Quay, in Sydney Cove, Port Jackson, having been made by the Justices appointed to execute the duties of Police Magistrates within the City and Port of Sydney, and approved by His Excellency the Governor, in terms of the Act of the Governor and Council, 5 William IV., No. 13, are published for general information.

RULES FOR THE REGULATION OF THE CIRCULAR QUAY, IN SYDNEY COVE, PORT JACKSON.

Ist.—That wheresoever the word Quay is used in the following Regulations, the same shall be held to mean all that space within two hundred and forty-nine feet of the outer or water's edge of the top step of the Circular Wharf, Sydney Cove.

2nd.—That no vessel shall be moored off the Circular Quay, except in such position as shall be determined by the Port Master or other person acting under his direction.

3rd.—That no warp or hawser shall be made fast or remain within fifteen feet of the top step of

the Quay.

4th.—That no carriage, dray, or barrow shall stand within thirty feet of the outer edge of the Wharf, nor in the lines of road or thoroughfares leading from Castlereagh-street or the Custom House to any of the landing steps of the Wharf.

5th.—That no cart, dray, or barrow coming within thirty feet of the edge of the Wharf for the purpose of loading or unloading shall remain there longer than such time as may be required for

such purpose.

6th.—That no goods, ballast, or lumber of any description placed on the Wharf, shall be allowed to remain thereon longer than forty-eight hours from the time of being so placed, unless by the special authority in writing of the Port Master.

7th.—That no boat plying for hire shall remain at the steps after landing passengers, nor lay off in front of the steps in such manner as will obstruct the passage to and from such landing steps.

Sth.—That no such boat (excepting the boat of the waterman next in turn for a fare) shall remain nearer than ten feet of the top step of the landing places.

9th.—That no boat shall ply for hire at the Circular Wharf except at the steps nearly opposite the

Custom House.

10th.—'That no ship's long boat shall land or take in goods at any of the landing steps of the Circular Wharf.

11th.—That any person who may commit a breach of these Regulations, or any one of them, shall, on conviction before any Justice or Justices of the Peace for the City of Sydney, forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than five shillings, nor more

than twenty shillings.

12th.—That all penalties imposed under the foregoing Regulations, together with costs, shall be paid forthwith, or within such time as the convicting Justice or Justices shall direct, or in default of such payment, shall be levied by distress and sale of the offending parties' goods and chattels, by warrant under the hand and seal or hands and seals of such Justice or Justices as aforesaid, and should sufficient distress not be found, then the offender or offenders shall, by warant under the hand and seal or hands and seals of such Justice or Justices, be committed to the common gaol at Darlinghurst, for any time not exceeding one calendar month.
